## 2012: Outlook

One of four returning AVCA All-Americans from a year ago, senior Lauren Cook looks to lead the Huskers offensively again in 2012 • Guided the Huskers' one-setter offensive system in 2011 after running a 6-2 attack in 2010 • Was a 2011 AVCA Honorable-Mention All-American • Also earned first-team All-Big Ten honors • Guided the Huskers to undefeated play at the 2011 Ameritas Players Challenge and the MCM Elegante Lobo Classic • Was named to the all-tournament team for the Ameritas Player's Challenge (MVP) and the MCM Elegante Lobo Classic • Ranked in the top 50 nationally in 2011 in assists (11.03) • Began her career at UCLA, helping the Bruins to a 24-9 record • Was named the 2009 AVCA National Freshman of the Year and the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year.

"Lauren has proven over the past three years to be one of the top setters in the country," head Coach John Cook said. "She has worked really hard to take her play to another level this year. We expect great things from her, not only as a setter and leading our offense, but also as a captain."

## 2011: Junior

Cook took over at setter after sharing the position with two-time All-American Sydney Anderson in NU's 6-2 rotation in 2010 • Helped the Huskers hit .300 or better in 10 matches in 2011, including two matches over .400 • Earned AVCA Honorable-Mention All-America award, AVCA All-Mideast Regional honorable-mention accolades and was selected as a first-team All-Big Ten selection • Helped the Huskers hit a season-high .438 against Jackson State on Dec. 1 • Was named to the preseason All-Big Ten team • Led NU with 18 double-doubles on the year (assists-digs), giving her 37 career double-doubles at Nebraska • Ranked fourth on the team in aces with a total of 15 • Had just nine serving errors in 512 attempts on the season (.982) • Averaged 11.03 assists per set, 0.14 aces per set and 2.79 digs per set • Topped the 40-assist mark 13 times during the season, including a career-high 62 assists against Kansas State on Dec. 2 • Recorded 54 assists as the Huskers hit .361 in their 3-1 victory over then-No. 1 Illinois on Oct. 22 • Opened the season with 51 assists against New Mexico State, guiding the Huskers to a comeback win • Finished the season ranked 38th in the country in assists per set (11.03) and fourth in the conference in assists per set • Recorded an efficient .943 assist percentage against Indiana on Oct. 8, notching 33 assists on 35 attempts • Earned a spot on the MCM Elegante Lobo Classic All-Tournament team as she totaled 91 assists on the weekend against New Mexico and New Mexico State • Also was named to the Ameritas Players Challenge All-Tournament Team and was selected as the team's MVP after notching 122 assists and 40.6 assists per match against Creighton, St. Mary's and Weber State • Was also honored as an academic All-Big Ten selection.

## 2010: Sophomore

In her first season with the Huskers, Cook shared the setter position with two-time All-American Sydney Anderson in NU's 6-2 rotation • Played in all 32 matches,

including 18 starts • Helped the Huskers hit .300 or better in 14 matches, including two matches over .400 • Was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year after averaging a team-high 6.08 assists per set to help the Huskers hit .284 on the year • Notched three double-doubles on the year and ranked second on the team with 0.25 aces per set • Produced an ace in 10 straight matches from Aug. 29 through Sept. 18 • Had 15 or more assists in two of Nebraska's three NCAA Tournament matches, including 20 in NU's opening-round sweep of Sacred Heart when NU hit a season-high .429 • Had just six serving errors in 327 attempts during conference play (.982) • Had 15 assists in NU's Big 12 championship clinching victory over Texas A&M on Nov. 27 to help the Huskers hit .320 • Produced two aces in consecutive matches against Oklahoma on Nov. 17 and Baylor on Nov. 24 • Posted 28 assists at Kansas on Nov. 3, as NU hit a regular-season best .423 • Had 20 or

more assists in five straight matches from Oct. 20 through Nov. 3 • Helped the Huskers hit .390 or better in back-to-back matches against Texas Tech on Oct. 20 and Missouri on Oct. 23 • Tied her career high in aces with three at Kansas State on Oct. 16 • Netted 27 assists in a 3-1 win over No. 13 Texas on Oct. 2 in Lincoln • Had 30 assists in a home win over Kansas on Sept. 22 • Posted 26 more assists in four straight wins over Dayton (28), Western Michigan (26), Illinois (28) and Iowa State (26) • Put up a season-high 31 assists and one ace against Florida at the Runza/AVCA Showcase in Omaha on Aug. 29.

**Before Nebraska**

Cook began her career at UCLA, helping the Bruins to a 24-9 record and a No. 14 final ranking in 2009 • Named 2009 AVCA National Freshman of the Year, as she averaged 10.69 assists, 2.44 digs, 0.77 kills and 0.40 blocks per set to become the first Bruin to ever win the award • Selected as the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and was an honorable-mention all-conference pick • Totaled 16 double-doubles and finished among team leaders in both aces (21, third) and digs (fourth) • Surpassed the 50-assist mark four times, recording a season-best 56 assists at Oregon on Nov. 21 • Chosen as the MVP of the Ameritas Players Challenge, averaging 10.38 assists, 1.15 kills per set on .519 hitting and 3.38 digs per set in three wins • Was one of the nation's top high school players at Lincoln Pius X for Coach Jake Moore • Led Pius X to three straight Class B state titles, earning first-team all-state honors in each of her last three seasons • Named the Andi Collins Award winner for the nation's top high school senior setter in 2008 and was the 2008 MaxPreps National Player of the Year • Established the state record with 4,399 career assists and was an All-American by Volleyball Magazine • Selected for the AVCA/Under Armour High School All-America match in Tampa, Fla. • Named to Volleyball Magazine's Fab 50 • Ranked as the No. 18 senior nationally by Prepvolleyball.com • Chosen as the 2007 Gatorade Nebraska Volleyball Player of the Year, as she established a state single-season assists record with 1,341 • Garnered Academic All-State honors each season at Pius X • Played



club volleyball for the Nebraska Juniors and Coach Gwen Egbert and was a starter on the 2009 Junior Olympic 18-and-Under Open Division national championship team • Won the 17-and-Under national Division at the 2007 JOs • Competed in track for two seasons and in basketball as

a freshman • Has been around volleyball her whole life, as her father (John) has been the head coach at Nebraska since 2000, while her mother (Wendy) was a two-time All-American setter at San Diego State in 1978 and 1979 and was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in 1998.

### 2012: Outlook

After being a key reserve for the Huskers during her first two seasons at Nebraska, junior Gina Mancuso (Man-CUE-so) had a breakout year as a starter at outside hitter during her junior season • Earned first-team AVCA All-America honors in 2011 • Elevated her play in her third year, leading the Huskers in kills and points • • Was a first-team All-Big Ten selection • Recorded career bests in kills, attacks, block assists and total blocks as a junior • Has played in 84 matches over her first three seasons • Possesses an outstanding skill set and is considered an advanced passer and defender for an outside hitter • Is a multi-skilled performer whose skills and knowledge make her valuable in Nebraska's plans • Wears No. 7, the same number her older sister Dani wore during her Husker career • Former Gatorade National Player of the Year who was the MVP of the Nebraska Juniors 18-and-Under National title team in 2009.

"Gina had a breakout year last year and has continued to improve her strength and conditioning with the efforts she has given over the spring and the summer," Coach John Cook said. "We expect her to perform at a very high level, proving that she is one of the elite left-side hitters in the country."

### 2011: Junior

Mancuso earned first-team AVCA All-America honors after leading the Huskers with 3.60 kills per set, 2.66 digs per set and 0.54 blocks per set • Was a key asset in helping the Huskers earn their first Big Ten championship • Named a second-team All-American by Volleyball Magazine • Earned AVCA first-team All-Mideast Region honors • Named a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-District VII selection • Was named to the Ameritas Players Challenge

and the MCM Elegante Lobo Classic all-tournament team • Also earned academic All-Big Ten honors • Was a unanimous first-team All-Big Ten pick • Led the Huskers in kills, totaling 407 on the year • Her efforts kept her ranked in the top 10 in the Big Ten Conference for total kills during the entire season • She was named the Big Ten Player-of-the-Week after leading the Huskers to back-to-back wins over Penn State and Ohio State and then again for helping Nebraska post wins over Iowa and top-ranked Illinois • Notched at least 10 kills in 27 matches during 2011 • Posted a career-high 25 kills against Kansas State • Recorded a double-double against Penn State with 22 kills and 10 digs, also tying her career-high mark for attacks • Recorded a double-double with 15 kills and 14 digs, adding five blocks and two aces to help the Huskers take down Illinois, the first win over a No. 1-ranked opponent since 1990 • Recorded 13 double-doubles on the year • Posted a career-high 19 digs against Purdue on Oct. 7 • Notched a hitting percentage of .400 or better on five occasions, including a .500 hitting percentage against Weber State on Sept. 10 • Hit over .300 for the first four matches of the season • Finished with three service aces against Iowa State on Sept. 17 • Completed the season ranked eighth in the Big Ten in kills (3.60) and ninth in points (4.08) • Led the Huskers in attacks, points, kills and aces in 2011.

### 2010: Sophomore

Mancuso provided depth at outside hitter in 22 matches with five starts • Averaged 1.79 kills and 0.15 aces per set, while hitting .250 • Saw action in all three of Nebraska's NCAA Tournament matches • Had five kills on seven swings (.714) in one set of action against Sacred Heart to open postseason play • Tied her career high in total blocks with four and put away an ace at Baylor on Nov. 24 • Took 18 swings, dug 10 balls and added two

Allison McNeal is a talented middle blocker returning for the Huskers in 2012 • Will look to close her Husker career in solid fashion after missing the 2011 season with an injury • Started 17 matches in 2010, averaging 1.33 kills and 0.88 blocks per set • Possesses the tools to be an elite middle blocker with outstanding leaping ability and long arms • Combines size and athleticism that creates difficult angles for opponents • Has played behind three All-Big 12 performers at middle blocker (Kori Cooper, Brooke Delano and Amanda Gates) • Former state high jump champion in Texas who was the No. 4 recruit nationally in 2008.

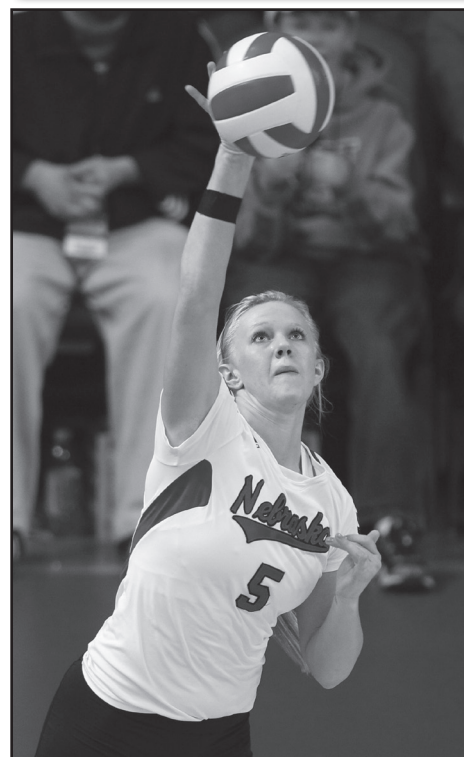

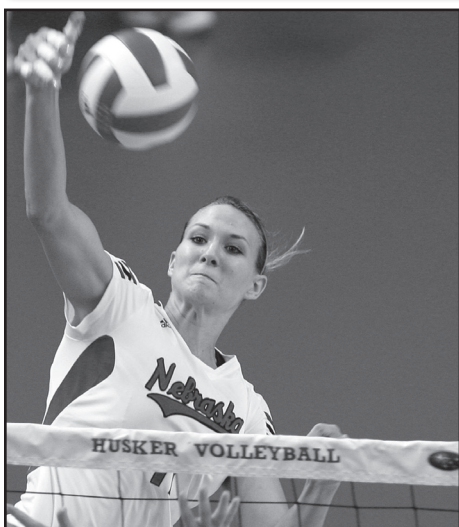

Hayley Thramer (pronounce Tray-mer) produced a strong sophomore campaign for the Huskers after suffering a shoulder injury prior to the 2010 season • Made a strong push to be in the Huskers' middle blocker rotation and saw extended playing time as the season progressed • Made an immediate impact as the Huskers took on New Mexico State in the 2011 opener, recording eight blocks • Led the Huskers in blocks per set and ranked second on the team in total blocks with 100 • Is a very fluid athlete with long arms and the ability to disrupt at the net • Has been around winning teams throughout her career, winning four state titles in high school while joining Gina Mancuso and Lauren Cook on the Nebraska Juniors 18-and-Under national championship squad in 2009.
