# RIFLE GLOSSARY

**Air rifle** – A gun that uses a .177 caliber lead pellet propelled by compressed air instead of a gunpowder charge. The rifles can weigh up to 12.12 pounds.

**Bull** – Short for bull's-eye. There are 12 bulls per target, 10 for competition and two for sighting shots. The 10 ring is actually a dot in the center of the bull's-eye. In smallbore, the 10 dot is slightly larger than a pin head, but must be completely gone to score 10 points. In air rifle the 10 dot is slightly larger than the period at the end of this sentence.

**Cleaned** – A perfect target, in which the shooter hits a 10 on each of the 10 targets on the sheet for a score of 100. Can also be used to refer to a perfect match.

**Front sight** – The sight attached to the end of the barrel of the rifle, holding the front aperture.

**Full course** – In smallbore, a full course consists of 120 record shots, 40 in each position, fired in the following order: prone, standing, kneeling.

**Half course** – In smallbore, a half course consists of 60 shots, 20 in each position (prone, standing and kneeling).

**Electronic Targets** – A target system that uses microphones and sound waves from the bullet or pellet going through the paper to send to a monitor on each point.

**Iron sights** – Sights that employ no magnification.

**Kneeling** – Shooting from a kneeling position with a sling and kneeling roll to support the position.

**Off hand** – The unsupported standing position.

**Perfect match score** – In air rifle and smallbore, 600 is perfect.

**Plug** – A metal device used to score targets. Variations include the "inward plug" and "outward plug." With the inward plug, the score is determined by the contact point of the outside edge of the plug with the inside of the next highest scoring ring. With an outward plug, the score is determined by the contact point of the outer edge of the plug with the inside of the next lowest scoring ring.

**Prone** – Shooting from a lying position.

**Range Officer** – The person in charge of timing the match and "running the line," which includes assisting shooters who are having difficulties and enforcing rules governing the match.

**Record shots** – Also known as "shots for record," those shots that are counted toward the match score, with "sighters" not included.

**Relay** – One group of shooters firing the match at the same time.

**Shooting glove** – A padded glove, with or without fingers, used to ensure the comfort of the non-dominant hand (i.e., a right-handed shooter wears a glove on the left hand) as the shooter supports the rifle.

**Shooting jacket** – The jacket is made of leather or canvas and provides support and pads the shooter to minimize the effect of pulse and recoil. There are strict guidelines regarding the thickness.

**Shooting boots** – Boots designed for rifle shooting. They have the toe end of the sole and the heel cut flat for stability.

**Shooting trousers** – Snug canvas and/or leather pants usually worn over running tights or sweatpants. They often have padded reinforcements sewn on both knees and the seat to prevent the slipping of elbows and knees when firing from the kneeling position.

**Sighting shots** – Practice shots taken before going "for record." Sighting shots are unlimited and may be fired before the beginning of each position. Once a position's first record shot has been fired, no further sighting shots are permitted.

**Sling** – Adjustable strap with buckle adjustments and arm cuffs that provide stability. A sling is attached to the rifle and helps to support it in prone and kneeling positions.

**Smallbore** – A .22 caliber gun with an iron sight used in competition. It can be customized with special accessories and/or alterations (barrel length and style, stock, design, etc.) to fit the shooter's needs and comforts.

**Spotting scope** – A type of telescope used to locate shots in the target.

**Tie Breaking** – In NCAA competition, ties are broken as follows: 1) by the highest score in the last 10 shots; 2) by the highest number of 10s, 9s and 8s; or 3) by the highest number of inner 10s. When shooting other smallbore and air rifle competitions, ties are addressed by the rule book of either the National Rifle Association or USA Shooting.

## SCORING SYSTEM

### Air Rifle

**Course of Fire** – Competitors stand and shoot lead pellets from .177 caliber rifles at targets 10 meters away.

**Rifle** – Air rifles can be either air or gas powered and weigh up to 12.12 pounds by NCAA regulations.

**Time** – Competitors have 105 minutes to fire 60 shots from the standing position.

**Perfect Match Score** – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for air rifle.

### Smallbore

**Course of Fire** – In smallbore three-position rifle, athletes fire .22 caliber rifles from the prone, standing and kneeling (also called off hand) positions at targets 50 feet away.

**Rifle** – Smallbore rifles may not exceed 17.6 pounds by NCAA regulations.

**Time** – Competitors have 120 minutes for 20 record shots in the prone position, 20 record shots in the standing position and 20 record shots in the kneeling position.

**Perfect Match Score** – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for smallbore.

# NU RIFLE RANGE

In April 2006, Nebraska became just the second university in the nation to add electronic targets to its rifle facilities. First seen only in international and Olympic competition, the electronic targets were added to the U.S. Air Force Academy's facilities before the Huskers adopted the new technology.

Electronic targeting enables shooters to aim at only one target instead of 10 different targets. The machine contains a roll of black paper, which refills the

open target with a clean piece of paper after every shot. Four microphones in the electronic targets sense the precision of the shot, transmitting the information to an online computer monitor.

"Our facility provides several advantages and the first is when you're training. Our target scoring system gives you an immediate and extremely accurate visual feedback on your shot without the old time hassles of reeling in and inspecting targets. This feedback

also means our shooters can train more effectively and efficiently.

"The second advantage is the range is located right on campus. Our shooters have lots of time demands from training, classes, studying, and competing - so closer saves time.

"Finally, we also have the added benefit of a nicely equipped rifle athlete lounge next to the range. It's a great spot for team members to relax, hang out, or study."

Our target scoring system gives you an immediate and extremely accurate visual feedback on your shot without the old time hassles of reeling in and inspecting targets. This feedback also means our shooters can train more effectively and efficiently. They can make the minor adjustments to their shot protocol without breaking down their positions and immediately know the results of these adjustments.

# UNDERWOOD LEADS HUSKERS INTO NEW ERA

A new era began for the Nebraska rifle program when it named Stacy Underwood the fourth head coach of the Huskers on May 24, 2012. A former Nebraska shooter and two-time NRA All-American, Underwood returns to her alma mater after serving as an assistant coach for six years under Coach Harry Mullins at Kentucky.

Underwood's wealth of experience and knowledge should make an immediate impact on the Husker program, which finished the 2011-12 season with a 10-15-1 record and a third-place finish at the 2012 GARC Championships.

"Last season the team ended their season with a great performance at the conference championships," Underwood said. "We plan on using that success as the foundation for this year and focus on the little things that will help us consistently perform at the next level."

The Nebraska rifle team will bring a combination of experienced veterans and young talent to the range this season, returning six shooters from last year's squad while adding four freshman competitors to the mix.

"We are fortunate to have most of last year's team return," Underwood said. "The upperclassmen have embraced their roles in the program and have taken the new team members under their wings. The team is starting to see that each team member is a valuable part of this program, and their individual efforts are essential to carry on the program's tradition of success here at Nebraska."

NU will be led on the range this season by a trio of seniors in Janine Dutton, Joyce Kim and Katelyn Woltersdorf. Dutton, a two-time honorable-mention NRA All-American in air rifle and a three-time All-GARC selection, has been one of Nebraska's top shooters throughout her career. A native of Eagle River, Alaska, Dutton will contend for All-America honors this season as she continues her role as one of Nebraska's most reliable threats.

Kim's consistent improvement on the range over the last three seasons points to a bright season for the senior from Gilbert, Ariz. She logged 13 smallbore appearances in 2011-12 while leading the team in individual smallbore titles (two). An academic All-Big Ten pick in 2012, Kim will look for a strong finish to her Husker career both in the classroom and on the rifle range.

Woltersdorf stepped up in a big way for the

Huskers in 2011-12, appearing 13 times in both disciplines for NU while adding a sixth-place GARC smallbore finish (586). The Battle Ground, Wash. native has also shown marked improvement over her last two seasons at Nebraska. She will be one of Nebraska's top smallbore competitors during her final year with the Big Red.

Nebraska's 2012-13 roster will gain experienced depth in juniors Sunny Russell and ReAnn Wilson. Russell, a native of Stratford, Texas, will look to continue her work as a leader in the classroom for the Huskers. Russell made 18 combined smallbore and air rifle appearances and was a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, an academic All-Big Ten selection and a CRCA All-Academic honoree in 2012.

Wilson will add depth to the Husker lineup this season as she vies for a spot in the NU smallbore and air rifle lineups. The junior from Bozeman, Mont. made five appearances each in smallbore and air rifle last season and claimed the fifth-best air rifle average on the team (574.80).

NU's final returner from last season is sophomore Kelsey Hansen, who made a splash in her first

season as a Husker. Hansen picked up Nebraska's only individual combined title in 2011-12 and was one of only four Huskers to appear in all 13 matches in both disciplines. The native of Minot, N.D., will aim to increase her contributions as one of the Huskers' top shooters in 2012-13.

The Huskers will round out their roster with the addition of four talented newcomers this season.-freshmen Alexandra Lorentz, Marissa Major, Denise Martin and Magdalena Mical.

Lorentz comes to Nebraska from West Anchorage High School in Anchorage, Alaska, bringing a wealth of competitive experience with her. A member of the Borealis Bullseyes club team, Lorentz and her team finished second at the 2010 Junior Olympics in the Precision Team Championships and took fifth in the same category in 2012.

A native of Arvada, Colo., Major shot with the Arvada Rifle and Pistol Club for five years before arriving at Nebraska. The club's co-athlete of the year in 2012, Major finished first in the NRA Junior 3-P Air Rifle Precision competition in her division.

Martin, a three-time Washington state champion from Chewelah, Wash., will bring both national and international experience to the NU rifle range this season. She was a member of the USA Shooting team at the 2010 International Shooting Sports Federation (ISSF) Junior World Championships in Munich, Germany. Martin was also the 2009 Junior Olympic Three-Position Air Rifle Precision Class champion.

Rounding out Nebraska's freshman class is Mical, who finished first in smallbore at the 2011 Florida Junior Olympic Qualifier. A native of Clearwater, Fla., Mical was also the Florida Metric Prone State champion in 2010.

Nebraska's 2012-13 schedule features a talented array of opponents that will challenge the Huskers. Nebraska will kick off its season with a three-match home stand beginning on Oct. 5, when the Huskers welcome North Carolina State to the NU Rifle Range. The Big Red will wrap up their opening weekend on Oct. 7, competing against Alaska-Fairbanks at home.

Nebraska's final home match of the fall will come on Oct. 13, when the Huskers welcome the 2011 national champion Kentucky Wildcats to Lincoln. The match should serve as an excellent early-season test for the Huskers as they head into a streak of away matches to close out the fall.

NU will hit the road the following weekend, traveling to Oxford, Miss., to take on the Mississippi Rebels on Oct. 20. The Huskers will then travel north, facing TCU and Ohio State on successive days in Columbus, Ohio. Nebraska will face perennial power and 2012 national champion TCU on Nov. 10, before challenging Ohio State on Nov. 11.

The Huskers will close out their fall slate of matches just one week later, journeying to Colorado Springs, Colo., to face the Air Force Academy Falcons and former Nebraska head coach Launi Meili on Nov. 17.

Nebraska will take an eight-week break before moving into the second half of its season in early 2013. The Huskers will begin on Jan. 12 with a rematch with Meili's Air Force Academy Falcons in the friendly confines of the NU Rifle Range.

The Huskers will head east as they continue their spring slate of matches, journeying first to Morgantown, W.V., as they face the West Virginia Mountaineers on Jan. 19. Nebraska will move farther south the following weekend, facing a slate of opponents at the Withrow Invitational in Murray, Ky., on Jan. 27.

Nebraska will return home for their final regular-season match at the NU Rifle Range on Feb. 9. The Huskers will host the Army Black Knights in Lincoln as they prepare for postseason competition.

NU will begin postseason action on Feb. 17, as they travel to the NCAA Qualifying match in Murray,

Ky. The Huskers will be vying for both team and individual spots at the 2013 NCAA Championships. The team will then head south for the 2013 Great America Rifle Conference (GARC) Championships in Oxford, Miss., which will take place on Feb. 22-23.

Nebraska will close its season at the 2013 NCAA Rifle Championships on March 8-9. The championship is slated to take place in Columbus, Ohio at Converse Hall and French Field House.
