THE MATCHUP

Nebraska goes on the road for the first time in the 2013 season, traveling to West Lafayette, Ind., to take on Purdue on Saturday. Game time at Purdue's Ross-Ade Stadium is set for Noon local time (11 a.m. CT), with the Big Ten Network providing television coverage of the contest.

The Huskers enter the game with a 4-1 record overall, and a 1-0 Big Ten mark, following a 39-19 victory over Illinois last Saturday in Lincoln. The Nebraska offense was strong in the victory, racking up 335 rushing yards and 521 yards of total offense. With the win, NU moved up one spot to 24th in the USA Today/Coaches Poll and continues to receive votes in the Associated Press poll.

Purdue will come into the contest with a 1-4 record, and an 0-1 mark in Big Ten Conference play. The Boilermakers were off last weekend following a home loss to Northern Illinois on Sept. 28. Purdue is playing its second Big Ten Conference game after opening league play with a loss at Wisconsin on Sept. 21.

The matchup between Nebraska and Purdue is just the second ever between the two schools and the first since Purdue defeated Nebraska in West Lafayette in 1958.

THE SERIES

Saturday's matchup will be the first between Nebraska and Purdue as Big Ten opponents, and just the second ever between the schools. Purdue defeated Nebraska, 28-0, in 1958 in West Lafayette. Nebraska and Purdue will play each year in the future with the schools both set to compete in the Big Ten's West Division. Purdue is scheduled to make their first visit to Lincoln on Nov. 1, 2014.

THE COACHES

Nebraska: Bo Pelini (Ohio State, '90) owns a 53-21 record (.716) in his sixth season. Pelini has guided NU to nine or more wins in each of his first five seasons as head coach, joining Bob Devaney and Tom Osborne in accomplishing that feat at Nebraska. With Nebraska's win over Wyoming in the season opener, Pelini became the fifth coach in NU history to win 50 games on the NU sideline, joining Dana Bible, Bob Devaney, Tom Osborne and Frank Solich.

Purdue: Darrell Hazell (Muskingum, '86) is in his first season as the head coach at Purdue and his third season overall as a college head coach. Hazell has a 1-4 record with the Boilermakers and a 17-14 overall record. He spent the previous two seasons as the head coach at Kent State, guiding his team to an 11-3 record in 2012. Hazell spent 24 seasons as an assistant coach, including stops at Ohio State, Rutgers and West Virginia.

NOTING GAME FIVE...NEBRASKA 39, ILLINOIS 19

► The victory improved Nebraska to 4-1, marking the fifth straight season NU has started 4-1 or better through five games. The Huskers improved to 8-2-1 all-time against Illinois, including 6-1 in Lincoln. Nebraska won its conference opener for the 36th time in 39 seasons, and won its Homecoming game for the 42nd time in the past 45 games.

► Junior I-back **Ameer Abdullah** rushed 20 times for a career-high 225 yards and two touchdowns. Abdullah's 200-yard rushing game is the first by a Husker since Taylor Martinez ran for 205 yards on 17 carries at Michigan State last season. Abdullah's 225 rushing yards are the most by an NU player since Roy Helu Jr. rushed for a school-record 307 yards against Missouri on Oct. 30, 2010.

► The 100-yard rushing day marks Abdullah's fourth 100-yard rushing game of 2013 and the 10th of his career. Abdullah increased his career rushing total to 1,977, moving him within 23 yards of becoming the 28th player to record 2,000 career rushing yards.

► Abdullah had a 30-yard run in the first quarter to set up the game's opening score. He added a 43-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, and an additional 33-yard run in the third quarter. Abdullah now has six runs of at least 30 yards this season.

► Senior receiver **Quincy Enunwa** became the 22nd player in school history with 1,000 career receiving yards. Enunwa eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark with a 26-yard reception in the first quarter on his first catch of the day. Enunwa finished with four catches for a season-high 80 yards, the most by a Nebraska receiver this season. Enunwa has 1,055 career receiving yards. The 26-yard reception also moved Enunwa into the top 10 on the NU career receptions list. Enunwa has 85 career receptions to rank 10th in school history.

► Junior receiver **Kenny Bell** caught four passes for 65 yards, and a 37-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter. With his 65 receiving yards, Bell pushed his career total to 1,579 yards, moving him into the top five on the NU career receiving yardage list, passing Niles Paul (1,532 yards).

► Bell has three touchdown catches this season and 14 in his career. Bell's 14 touchdown catches put him in a tie for fifth on the NU career TD receptions list. Bell's last 12 touchdown catches have all covered at least 20 yards.

► Redshirt freshman quarterback **Tommy Armstrong Jr.** completed 8-of-13 passes for 135 yards and two touchdowns. Armstrong also rushed for 18 yards. Armstrong guided Nebraska to touchdowns on each of his first three drives.

► Nebraska rushed for 335 yards, marking the 16th time in 19 games since the start of the 2012 season that NU has rushed for at least 200 yards. Nebraska posted its 15th 300-yard rushing game in Bo Pelini's six seasons, including its third this year (Wyoming, South Dakota State).

► Nebraska forced an Illinois fumble in the first quarter and intercepted a third-quarter pass. Overall, Nebraska has forced 12 turnovers this season and turned those 12 turnovers into 63 points. Nebraska was +1 in turnover margin, marking the fifth straight game to start the season that Nebraska has been positive or even in turnover margin.

► Nebraska totaled three sacks for 16 yards, marking the third straight game with at least three sacks.

► NU did not punt in the first half, marking the second straight game Nebraska did not have a punt before halftime.

► Redshirt freshman **Michael Rose** led the Huskers with a career-high 11 tackles in his first career start.

► Senior **Ciante Evans** produced one sack for 11 yards, forced a fumble that was recovered, totaled two TFL's for 14 yards, had one pass break-up and one QB hurry that led to Jason Ankrah's third-quarter interception.

► Nebraska had four first-time starters, including wide receiver **Alonzo Moore**, defensive tackle **Aaron Curry**, and linebackers **Michael Rose** and **Jared Afalava**.

NEBRASKA HEAD COACH BO PELINI

Bo Pelini is in his sixth season as Nebraska's head coach and owns a 53-21 record with the Huskers. Pelini added a Big Ten Legends Division title in 2012 to three straight Big 12 North Division crowns from 2008 to 2010, when Pelini was the the first coach in the history of the Big 12 to win at least a share of a division title in each of his first three years.

He has guided Nebraska to at least nine wins each of his first five seasons in Lincoln, and three 10-win seasons. With the win over Wyoming in the opener, Pelini reached 50 career wins at Nebraska, making him just the fifth Husker coach to reach that milestone, joining Tom Osborne, Bob Devaney, Frank Solich and Dana X. Bible.

Pelini took charge of the Huskers after a highly successful five-year run as a collegiate defensive coordinator, including orchestrating NU's defensive efforts in 2003. Pelini picked up his first college head coaching victory as NU's interim coach in the 2003 Alamo Bowl against Michigan State.

Following his one season at Nebraska, Pelini served as the co-defensive coordinator at Oklahoma in 2004, helping the Sooners to the Big 12 title and BCS title game. He then followed with three seasons as the defensive coordinator at LSU. With the Tigers, Pelini led three consecutive defenses to No. 3 national rankings in total defense. He culminated his time in Baton Rouge by helping the Tigers to the 2007 national championship.

In addition to his five seasons as an assistant at the collegiate level, Pelini coached in the NFL for nine seasons, serving three years each with the San Francisco 49ers, New England Patriots and Green Bay Packers. Pelini was a team captain and four-year letterman as a safety at Ohio State from 1987 to 1990.

PELINI STACKS UP WELL WITH PEERS

- In guiding Nebraska to a 53-21 record, Pelini has put himself in some impressive company.
- » Among schools currently in a BCS-AQ conference, Pelini was just the 11th head coach in college football history to win at least nine games in each of his first five seasons on the job at that school. The group includes three Nebraska coaches (Bob Devaney, Tom Osborne, Pelini).
- » When looking only at coaches in their first head coaching job at a BCS school, Pelini is one of only four to win nine games in each of their first five years, joining Osborne, Barry Switzer (Oklahoma) and Larry Coker (Miami).
- » Pelini was among a group of 18 FBS head coaches who were hired for their jobs beginning with the 2008 season. Pelini leads that group of 18 head coaches in victories over the past five-plus years with 52 wins. In fact, Pelini is one of only six coaches in the group of 18 still in the job they were hired for prior to the 2008 season.

PELINI CONTINUES DEFENSIVE ACCOMPLISHMENTS AT NEBRASKA

At Nebraska, Pelini has continued his history of building championship defenses. In 2009, the Huskers led the nation in scoring defense and had the nation's best scoring defensive improvement (18.1 ppg). When combining statistics from the past four-plus seasons, NU ranks third in pass efficiency defense, fourth in passing defense, 15th in scoring defense and 19th in total defense.

- With Pelini's previous track record, the success of his Nebraska defenses is no surprise.
- Pelini led the 2003 Blackshirts to a school-record 47 takeaways, including a Big 12-record 32 interceptions, and finished second nationally in scoring defense, first in pass efficiency defense and 11th in total defense.
- Pelini guided LSU defenses to No. 3 national finishes in total defense each of his three seasons in Baton Rouge.
- In 140 games as a collegiate coach, Pelini's defenses have posted 10 shutouts, held the opposition to seven points or less 40 times and to 20 points or less 89 times.

HUSKER STAFF RETURNS INTACT FOR 2013 SEASON

Nebraska's coaching staff has a familiar look in 2013, as all nine assistants returned to Coach Bo Pelini's staff. Nebraska's staff is one of 18 coaching staffs in the country to return intact this season.

Tim Beck is in his third season as offensive coordinator in 2013, after guiding Nebraska's offense to a top-10 national rushing effort last season. Seventh-year Nebraska assistant Barney Cotton adds the role of run game coordinator and will tutor the Nebraska tight ends this fall, in addition to his role with the offensive line. Ron Brown (running backs), Rich Fisher (wide receivers) and John Garrison (offensive line) also return to the offensive staff.

The defensive staff is under the direction of second-year coordinator John Papuchis. Last season, the Blackshirts ranked among the nation's top units in pass defense and pass efficiency defense. Returning to the defensive staff along with Papuchis are Ross Els (linebackers), Terry Joseph (secondary) and Rick Kaczinski (defensive line).

SCOUTING PURDUE

Purdue was off last weekend, as the Boilermakers have had two weeks to prepare for their Big Ten home opener against the Huskers. Purdue is 1-4 this fall, with its lone win coming over Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) opponent Indiana State. The Boilermakers are 0-4 against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents this year, losing those four games by an average of nearly four touchdowns per game.

During the off week, first-year Head Coach Darrell Hazell announced a quarterback change last week, tabbing true freshman Danny Etling as the new starter, replacing fifth-year senior Rob Henry.

Henry started each of Purdue's first five games this season, helping the Boilermakers average 301.6 yards of total offense per game and 17.0 points per contest. Both of those marks rank among the bottom 15 teams in the FBS ranks. The Boilermakers average 214.6 passing yards per game and 87.0 rushing yards per contest.

Henry is completing 53.6 percent of his passes this season, but has thrown six interceptions and just four touchdowns. Etling is completing 48.7 percent of his passes with two picks and two touchdowns. On the ground, Akeem Hunt is Purdue's leading rusher, averaging 38.6 yards per game.

Defensively, Purdue is allowing 413.6 yards per game and 36.6 points per contest. Each of the Boilermakers' four FBS opponents have scored at least 31 points while averaging 42.3 points per game. Purdue is allowing opponents to rush for

183.2 yards per game and nearly five yards per carry, while the Boilermakers are surrendering 230.4 passing yards per game.

Safety Taylor Richards is Purdue's leading tackler with 31 stops this season, while Bruce Gaston leads the team with 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 of Purdue's 9.0 sacks.

On special teams, Cody Webster is averaging 45.3 yards per punt and the Boilermakers are allowing just 4.0 yards per punt return to rank second nationally in net punting.

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game will mark just the second meeting between Nebraska and Purdue on the football field. Purdue shut out Nebraska, 28-0, in the only meeting On Sept. 27, 1958 in West Lafayette. Purdue is the only Big Ten team that Nebraska has never defeated.

PURDUE HEAD COACH DARRELL HAZELL

Darrell Hazell is in his first season at Purdue and his third season as a head coach overall. He picked up his first win as a Boilermaker on Sept. 7, when Purdue defeated Indiana State, 20-14. Overall, he owns a 1-4 record at Purdue and a 17-14 career record.

Hazell came to West Lafayette from Kent State, where he served as head coach in 2011 and 2012 and compiled a 16-10 record. In 2012, Kent State finished 11-3 and played in its first bowl game in 40 years. The 2012 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year, Hazell's Golden Flashes set a school record with 11 victories and defeated No. 15 Rutgers to post the program's first win over a ranked team. In 2011, Hazell guided Kent State to a 5-7 record with wins in four of the final five games.

A 27-year veteran of the college coaching ranks, Hazell previously coached at Ohio State (2004-09), Rutgers (2001-03), West Virginia (1999-2000), Army (1997-98), Western Michigan (1995-96), Pennsylvania (1992-94), Eastern Illinois (1988) and Oberlin (1986-87 and 1989-91).

NEBRASKA HITS THE ROAD FOR FIRST TIME IN 2013

Nebraska's game at Purdue on Saturday will mark its first road game of the 2013 season after five straight home games to start the year. The Oct. 12 road game marks Nebraska's latest road opener since playing its first road game in 2005 at Baylor on Oct. 15, and is Nebraska's third latest road opener on the calendar since 1970.

▶ Nebraska is 2-3 in its first road game of the season under Pelini, including a 36-30 loss at UCLA last season. The Huskers' three road opening losses under Pelini have been by a total of 13 points, including a six-point overtime loss at Texas Tech in 2008.

▶ The Huskers are also 2-3 in conference road openers under Pelini, including 0-2 in the Big Ten. Four of Nebraska's five road conference openers have come against ranked opponents, including both Big Ten road openers. NU lost at No. 7 Wisconsin in 2011, and at 12th-ranked Ohio State last season.

NEBRASKA-PURDUE TO BECOME AN ANNUAL MATCHUP

While Saturday's game is the first between Nebraska and Purdue as Big Ten foes, and just the second game between the schools overall, it also marks the first of what will become an annual matchup. This year, the Huskers and Purdue are competing in the Legends and Leaders divisions, respectively, but starting in 2014 both schools will play in the Big Ten West Division and will meet each fall. Purdue makes its first trip to Lincoln on Nov. 1, 2014.

NEBRASKA TOPS BIG TEN IN WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS IN CONFERENCE

Nebraska began its third season of Big Ten Conference action last Saturday with a 39-19 win over Illinois. Nebraska's victory was its 13th in 17 regular-season Big Ten games since joining the conference in 2011. The 13 wins since the start of the 2011 season are tied for the most in the Big Ten. The Huskers' 8-2 record in division play also leads the conference.

Nebraska captured the Legends Division crown and made a trip to the Big Ten Conference Championship Game in 2012. Nebraska has won seven straight regular-season conference games entering Saturday's game at Purdue.

NU SHOOTS FOR SIXTH STRAIGHT YEAR WITH NINE OR MORE WINS

Nebraska posted a 10-4 record in 2012, giving the Huskers nine or more victories in each of Bo Pelini's first five seasons as head coach. The streak of five straight nine-win seasons puts Nebraska in an elite class nationally.

▶ Nebraska is one of four schools that has won at least nine games each of the past five seasons. The others in that group include Alabama, Boise State and Oregon.

▶ Pelini has guided Nebraska to 10-win seasons in three of the last four years.

▶ The five straight years of at least nine wins marks the first time NU has accomplished that since its NCAA record streak of 33 straight nine-win seasons from 1969 to 2001.

▶ Nebraska has 47 nine-win seasons in school history, including 39 since 1969.

NU KEEPS RUNNING GAME IN HIGH GEAR IN 2013

Nebraska has featured one of the nation's top rushing attacks each of the past three seasons, and the Huskers are proving to be a dominant running team again in 2013.

The Husker running game came out of the gate fast in 2013, rushing for 375 yards in the season opener against Wyoming, with four players topping 75 yards on the ground. NU also eclipsed 300 yards on the ground against South Dakota State and Illinois, rushing for 335 yards in each of those games. Nebraska is averaging 291.6 rushing yards per game to rank second in the Big Ten and ninth nationally.

▶ Nebraska's 375 rushing yards vs. Wyoming were its most in a season opener since 2007. With back-to-back 300-yard games against South Dakota State and Illinois, Nebraska has topped 300 yards on the ground 15 times under Pelini, with six of those games coming since the start of the 2012 season. Nebraska is 15-0 in those games.

▶ Nebraska's 335 rushing yards against Illinois marked its second-highest total in a Big Ten Conference game and its most since rushing for 346 yards at Minnesota in 2011.

- ▶ Nebraska has reached at least 200 rushing yards in 16 of 19 games since the start of the 2012 season.
- ▶ Through five games, Nebraska I-backs **Ameer Abdullah** (690 yards), **Imani Cross** (274) and **Terrell Newby** (229) have combined for 1,193 rushing yards and 13 touchdowns. The group averages 6.7 yards per carry.
- ▶ Abdullah has reached 100 rushing yards in four of the first five games, including a career-high 225 yards against Illinois. Abdullah now has 10 career 100-yard rushing games. Cross also topped the century mark against Wyoming, giving Nebraska five 100-yard rushing games this season.
- ▶ Newby rushed 15 times for 76 yards in the season opener against Wyoming. Newby's rushing attempts and yards were the most by a true freshman in an opener since 2007. (Quentin Castille, 18-78)
- ▶ Cross scored two touchdowns against both Wyoming and South Dakota State and has four career games with two rushing touchdowns. Cross has 13 rushing touchdowns on 100 career carries, a touchdown every 7.7 carries for his career.
- ▶ The four players reaching at least 75 yards rushing vs. Wyoming marked the first time NU has reached that group milestone since four Huskers topped the century mark on the ground at Baylor in 2001.
- This year's rushing surge continues Nebraska's success on the ground. A year ago, NU averaged 253.4 rushing yards per game to lead the Big Ten and rank eighth nationally in rushing offense. The rushing average per game was the best by NU since the Huskers ran for 268.7 yards per game in 2002.
- ▶ Nebraska has averaged better than 200 rushing yards per game for three straight seasons and ranked in the top 15 nationally in that category each year from 2010 to 2012. In 2010, Nebraska ranked first in the Big 12 and ninth nationally, and in 2011 NU rushed for 217.2 yards per game, good for third in the Big Ten and 15th nationally.
- ▶ Nebraska returned a pair of 1,000-yard rushers for 2013 in Abdullah (1,137 yards) and quarterback **Taylor Martinez** (1,019 yards). The 2013 season marked the first time in school history Nebraska returned a pair of players who have rushed for 1,000 yards in a season.
- ▶ Nebraska was one of only two schools in the country with two players who topped 1,000 rushing yards last season returning this fall (Kent State).
- ▶ Nebraska has had a 1,000-yard rusher each of the past four seasons. That is the longest stretch for Nebraska since the Huskers had at least one 1,000-yard rusher from 1991 to 1995. Through the first five games of 2013, Abdullah is well on pace to reach that total again this fall.
- ▶ Nebraska posted a total of 15 individual 100-yard rushing games last season, and four games with a pair of 100-yard rushers. With Abdullah and Cross both surpassing 100 yards in the season opener, Nebraska now has 74 all-time games with two 100-yard rushers.
- ▶ Four different Huskers topped 100 yards in a game last season. Nebraska was one of only five schools to have four or more players reach the century mark.
- ▶ The Huskers were one of only four teams in the country with at least four players who averaged at least 5.0 yards per carry and had at least 50 carries. Nebraska had five players reach those milestones in 2012.
- The trio of Martinez, Abdullah and junior wide receiver **Kenny Bell** put Nebraska in some rare air in college football heading into the 2013 season.
- ▶ Nebraska was one of only three schools to return a 5,000-yard career passer, a 1,000-yard career receiver and two 1,000-yard career rushers for the 2013 season.
- ▶ Nebraska was one of only four teams with a 5,000-yard career passer, a 1,000-yard career receiver and a 2,000-yard career rusher returning for 2013.

HUSKERS STRIVING FOR BALANCED ATTACK AGAIN IN 2013

While leading the Big Ten in rushing in 2012, Nebraska also averaged better than 200 yards passing per game. The Huskers were one of only 19 schools in the country to average better than 200 yards per game in both rushing and passing in 2012, and the only Big Ten school in the 200-200 club last season.

Nebraska is back in the same club this season, averaging 291.6 rushing yards per game and 209.6 yards passing through five games. Nebraska is one of 31 teams in the country averaging 200 yards rushing and passing, and one of five schools in the Big Ten, joining Iowa, Northwestern, Ohio State and Wisconsin.

While the running game has been Nebraska's strength early in the season, NU's passing game has been very efficient. The Huskers have thrown just one interception to tie for second in the country in fewest interceptions. The Huskers also lead the nation in protecting the passer, allowing just two sacks in five games (0.40 pg).

ABDULLAH LOOKING FOR BACK-TO-BACK 1,000-YARD SEASONS

Junior I-back **Ameer Abdullah** became one of the Big Ten's top running backs in 2012, as he broke out with a 1,000-yard rushing season. Abdullah carried a heavy load in the rushing game, teaming with quarterback **Taylor Martinez** to give Nebraska a pair of 1,000-yard rushers, and is once again on track for an outstanding season in 2013.

Abdullah opened 2013 with a pair of 100-yard rushing games, rushing for 114 yards against both Wyoming and Southern Miss, including a career-long 62-yard run against Wyoming. He churned out a hard-fought 98 yards against UCLA, before rushing for 139 yards on 15 carries against South Dakota State. Abdullah carried the ball just once after halftime in the win over the Jackrabbits.

The non-conference season set the stage for a career day for Abdullah in the Big Ten opener against Illinois. Abdullah rushed 20 times for a career-high 225 yards and two touchdowns. He had three runs of better than 30 yards in the game, including a highlight-reel 43-yard TD run in the third quarter. His 225 yards were the most by a Husker since Roy Helu Jr. ran for a school-record 307 yards against Missouri in 2010. For his performance, Abdullah was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week. It was the first time Abdullah had earned the offensive player-of-the-week honors, but his fourth Big Ten weekly honor. He previously earned the Special Teams Player of the Week twice, and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week once in 2011.

HUSKERS CONTINUE TO LIGHT THE SCOREBOARD IN 2013

Nebraska is averaging 42.4 points per game to rank third in the Big Ten and 15th nationally in scoring. The Huskers scored 37 points in the opener against Wyoming, and topped 50 points against both Southern Miss and South Dakota State.

▶ The Huskers' 59 points against South Dakota State were the second-most Nebraska has scored in six seasons under Head Coach Bo Pelini, while the 56 points against Southern Miss tied for the third most. The two games give Nebraska eight 50-plus point outings under Pelini.

▶ Since the start of the 2012 season, Nebraska has scored at least 30 points in 14 of 19 games.

Abdullah now has 10 career 100-yard rushing efforts, including four in 2013. He is averaging 138.0 yards per game to rank second in the Big Ten and eighth nationally in rushing yards per game.

▶ With 690 rushing yards this season, Abdullah has 1,977 career rushing yards and ranks 29th on the NU career rushing chart. He is just 23 yards from becoming the 28th player in school history with 2,000 rushing yards. Abdullah would become just the 12th player to reach the 2,000-yard mark before their senior season.

▶ Abdullah is also on pace for a second consecutive 1,000-yard rushing season. He would be just the eighth player in school history to record back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

▶ Abdullah has shown big-play rushing ability this season. He broke loose for three runs of at least 30 yards against Illinois and has six rushes of 30 yards or more in 2013, including a career-long 62-yard run against Wyoming.

▶ In addition to his running skills, Abdullah is a receiving threat out of the backfield, with 12 receptions for 130 yards this season. His 164.0 all-purpose yards per game lead the Big Ten and rank 13th nationally.

▶ Abdullah was one of the nation's top kickoff return threats in 2011 and 2012. He has yet to return a kickoff this season, but has been back on the top kickoff return unit the past two weeks.

▶ Abdullah is one of only three active players in the country with a rushing, receiving, punt return and kickoff return touchdown in their career.

Abdullah finished the 2012 season with 1,137 yards, while averaging 5.0 yards per rushing attempt. He averaged 81.2 rushing yards per game and earned second-team All-Big Ten honors from the league's coaches, while being an honorable-mention pick by the media. Abdullah and Martinez posted the 32nd and 33rd 1,000-yard rushing seasons in NU history, and Abdullah's 1,000-yard campaign was the eighth in school history by a sophomore. His 1,137 yards ranked as the 19th-best single-season effort at Nebraska.

Abdullah had 1,884 all-purpose yards in 2012 to rank sixth on the NU single-season all-purpose yardage list. It was the most all-purpose yards for a Husker since 1997.

▶ Abdullah rushed for better than 100 yards in each of his first five career starts in 2012. He was the first Nebraska player to record 100-yard rushing games in each of his first five starts since Lawrence Phillips topped 100 yards in each of his first 11 starts in 1994.

▶ Abdullah was an explosive all-purpose threat for the Huskers in several areas in 2012. Abdullah averaged 13.1 yards per punt return, including an 81-yard return for a score against Idaho State. He also averaged 21.2 yards per kickoff return and had an 83-yard kickoff return against Wisconsin. Abdullah's 134.6 all-purpose yards per game were fourth in the Big Ten and 31st nationally.

MARTINEZ HOPEFUL OF RETURN VS. PURDUE

Nebraska senior quarterback Taylor Martinez has missed the past two games with a turf toe injury. He remains day-to-day as Nebraska prepares for its road opener this week at Purdue. When Martinez was not in the starting lineup for Nebraska's game against South Dakota State on Sept. 21 it ended a streak of 32 consecutive starts for the Husker signal caller. Martinez has been one of the most durable players in Nebraska history, with the SDSU game just the third game he did not start at quarterback since the beginning of the 2010 season.

Earlier this season, Martinez became the first quarterback in school history to start four consecutive season openers against Wyoming. Only Tommie Frazier (1993-94-95) and Steve Taylor (1986-87-88) had previously started three season openers at quarterback in NU school history. Martinez was one of just seven quarterbacks in the FBS ranks who started their fourth consecutive season opener in 2013, and he is the only player in the group to post a 4-0 record in those games.

Martinez has now made 42 career starts, the most ever for an NU quarterback.

MARTINEZ CONTINUES TO RE-WRITE NU RECORD BOOK

Martinez has made a sizeable dent in the Nebraska school record book during his first three seasons as a starter, holding 37 school records. With his senior season less than half completed, Martinez is in position to shatter more school marks, while statistically ranking among the top run-pass quarterbacks in college football history.

The Corona, Calif., native has already put up remarkable numbers, including:

▶ Martinez holds Nebraska's career total offense record with 10,078 yards. He set the Nebraska record midway through the 2012 season, surpassing the previous record of 7,915 yards by 2001 Heisman Trophy winner Eric Crouch.

▶ Martinez established a season total offense record in 2012, with 3,890 yards of total offense. He broke the previous record of 3,826 yards by Joe Ganz in 2008. Ganz now serves as a graduate assistant with the Huskers and helps tutor Martinez. Martinez has the top total offense seasons in school history for a freshman, sophomore and junior.

▶ Martinez threw for 2,871 yards in 2012, the third-best single-season total in Nebraska history. He now has 7,119 career passing yards at Nebraska. The previous career record of 5,850 yards was set by Zac Taylor in 2005-06.

▶ Martinez had 23 passing touchdowns in 2012, and has thrown for nine touchdowns this season. Martinez has a school-record 55 TD passes in his career, bettering Zac Taylor's career total of 45 passing touchdowns. Martinez opened the 2013 season with three passing touchdowns in each of the first three games and has six career games with three or more touchdown passes.

▶ Martinez accounted for a school-record 33 touchdowns in 2012 (23 pass, 10 rush), bettering the previous record of 32 by Gerry Gdowski in 1989. With nine touchdowns in 2013, Martinez has accounted for 86 touchdowns in his career, four shy of the school record of 90 by Crouch.

▶ With 1,019 rushing yards in 2012, Martinez posted the fourth 1,000-yard rushing season in school history by a NU quarterback. With 101 rushing yards in 2013, Martinez has increased his career rushing total to 2,959 yards. That figure ranks second among quarterbacks in school history, trailing only Crouch's 3,434 yards. Martinez is also eighth overall on the NU career rushing list and is 41 yards from becoming the eighth player overall and second NU quarterback to hit 3,000 career rushing yards. He would also become just the 15th quarterback in FBS history and third in Big Ten history to rush for 3,000 career yards.

MARTINEZ STATS STACK UP WELL ON NCAA ALL-TIME CHARTS

Martinez not only has impressive statistics on the school's all-time lists, but he also compares favorably with a number of quarterbacks nationally.

Combining the 2011 and 2012 seasons, Martinez threw for 4,960 yards, while rushing for 1,893 yards, good for a combined 6,853 yards of total offense. Martinez was one of only three quarterbacks to pass for 4,000 yards and rush for 1,500 yards in 2011-12, and one of only five to reach the 3,000/1,500 milestones. Martinez had the most total yards among that group of five quarterbacks.

In 2011 and 2012, Martinez's 6,853 yards of total offense ranked 10th nationally, while his rushing total ranked fifth among quarterbacks. He was one of only six quarterbacks in the FBS ranks to post a 2,000-yard passing/1,000-yard rushing season in either 2011 or 2012. Martinez was joined on that list by Denard Robinson (Michigan), Braxton Miller (Ohio State), Johnny Manziel (Texas A&M), Chandler Harnish (Northern Illinois) and Jordan Lynch (Northern Illinois).

▶ Martinez is in position to record 9,000 career passing yards and 3,000 rushing yards, needing 1,881 passing yards and 41 rushing yards to reach those figures. If he would accomplish that feat he would join Colin Kaepernick as the only players in FBS history to reach the 9,000/3,000 career mark.

▶ Martinez's 2,959 yards rushing are the third-most of any active FBS player who has played their entire career in the FBS ranks. His 10,078 yards of total offense are fifth among active players, and he has already placed his name alongside some of the game's top dual-threat signal callers. Against UCLA, Martinez became just the ninth player in Big Ten history with 10,000 career total offense yards.

HUSKERS EXTEND WINNING

NON-CONFERENCE STREAK

Nebraska's 59-20 victory over South Dakota State gave the Huskers a 3-1 non-conference record in 2013. The 3-1 record marks the 32nd consecutive season NU has had a winning non-conference season, dating back to a 2-2 non-league mark in 1981, when NU lost to Iowa and Penn State, while posting victories over Florida State and Auburn.

SEASON-OPENING WIN STREAK CONTINUES

Nebraska extended a remarkable streak of success in season openers with a 37-34 win over Wyoming. The win was Nebraska's 28th straight win in a season opener, dating back to a 1985 loss to Florida State.

The streak leads the nation, bettering Florida's 24 straight season-opening wins. Nebraska has scored at least 37 points in each of its six season openers under Coach Bo Pelini, and has scored 40 or more points in 20 of the past 28 seasons. During the win streak, NU has limited opponents to 14 points or less 18 times.

- ▶ Martinez is just the 12th player in FBS history to pass for 6,000 yards and rush for 2,500 yards in a career. He was one of only four players to reach that milestone before the end of their junior year, joining Kaepernick, Vince Young (Texas) and Brad Smith (Missouri). He is 41 rushing yards from becoming the fifth player in FBS history with 7,000 career passing yards and 3,000 career rushing yards. He would join Kaepernick, Smith, Josh Cribbs (Akron) and Antwaan Randle El (Indiana) in that category.
- ▶ Martinez needs two non-passing touchdowns to reach 200 career points scored. Martinez has scored 31 rushing touchdowns in his career - good for 186 points - while adding one two-point conversion to total 188 career points. With 12 more points scored, Martinez will become only the seventh player in NCAA FBS history to score 200 points and pass for 300 points. He would be the only Husker and only player in Big Ten history to reach that milestone.
- ▶ Martinez is also looking to become only the ninth player in NCAA history to rush for 40 TDs and pass for 40 TDs. He needs nine rushing touchdowns to reach that milestone.

BELL REACHES CENTURY MARK IN RECEPTIONS; CONTINUES CLIMB ON NU CHARTS

Nebraska returned arguably the finest trio of receivers in school history, led by junior **Kenny Bell**, who is in position to threaten several NU school records. Bell is joined by fellow junior **Jamal Turner** and senior **Quincy Enunwa** to give Nebraska one of the nation's top groups of receivers.

Bell has grabbed a team-high 22 catches for 255 yards and three touchdowns in 2013. He caught seven passes for 57 yards in the opener vs. Wyoming, with the seven catches the second-highest total of his NU career. He added three catches, including a 21-yard touchdown grab against Southern Miss, then followed with six receptions for 68 yards, including a 22-yard TD grab against UCLA.

Bell had a quiet day against South Dakota State with two catches, but his two receptions pushed his career receptions total to 100, making him the seventh Husker player with 100 career receptions. He had four catches for 65 yards against Illinois, including a spectacular 37-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter.

Bell's 65 yards receiving against Illinois moved him into the top five on the Husker career receiving yardage list. He is now less than 200 yards from moving into third place on the NU career receiving yardage list and remains on pace to threaten the career record.

Bell has 104 career receptions to rank sixth in school history, and is just five catches from moving into the top five on the NU career receptions list. He is well on his way to threatening the Nebraska career receptions record of 166 by Nate Swift from 2005 to 2008.

With three touchdown catches this season, Bell has pushed his career TD reception total to 14, good for a tie for fifth on the NU career TD reception list. He is just two touchdown catches from moving into a tie for third on the career chart. Bell has a knack for the big play. Each of his last 12 touchdown receptions have covered at least 20 yards, including all three of his TD catches in 2013.

Bell was a second-team All-Big Ten selection as a sophomore, when he led Nebraska with 50 receptions for 863 yards and eight touchdowns. The 50 receptions marked just the seventh time in school history a Husker player had reached 50 catches, and the 863 receiving yards were the fourth-highest single-season total in NU history. The receiving yardage was the most ever by an NU sophomore, shattering the previous mark of 665 yards by Johnny Rodgers in 1970.

- ▶ Bell's 50 receptions in 2012 ranked seventh on the NU single-season list.
- ▶ Bell had career highs of nine receptions for 136 yards and two touchdowns against Minnesota last season. His 136 receiving yards were the most by a Husker in three seasons and bettered his career high of 133 yards at Ohio State.
- ▶ Bell's 17.3 yards per catch in 2012 ranked second in the Big Ten and eighth nationally among players in the top 100 in receiving yards per game. His average was the 10th-best in Husker history among players with at least 30 catches in a season.
- ▶ Bell had 16 receptions in 2012 that covered at least 20 yards, with all eight of his touchdown catches coming from 25 yards or more. Bell had a career-long 74-yard reception at Ohio State on Oct. 6.
- ▶ Bell had a streak of 23 straight games with a catch end at Iowa in 2012. The 23-game streak was the third-longest in NU history.
- ▶ Bell reached the 1,000-yard career receiving mark in just his 20th career game, making him the second-fastest Husker to reach that plateau. Only 1972 Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Rodgers reached 1,000 career receiving yards in less than 20 games.

HUSKERS HIT 300-300 MARK AGAINST SOUTH DAKOTA STATE

The Nebraska offense marked a first in school history in its 59-20 win over South Dakota State. Nebraska rolled to 335 rushing yards, while adding 310 yards passing, marking the first time in school history, the Huskers have eclipsed 300 yards in both rushing and passing.

► The 645 yards of total offense marked the most for Nebraska in Bo Pelini's six seasons as head coach and ranked as the 21st most total yards in NU history.

► Nebraska gained better than 300 yards on the ground for the second time this season, and for the 14th time in Pelini's tenure as head coach.

► In addition to the total offensive explosion, Nebraska also posted 59 points in the win. The game marked the second time in 2013 NU has topped 50 points and the eighth time in Pelini's six seasons as head coach. The 59 points were the second-most of the Pelini era, trailing a 73-point outburst against Idaho State in 2012.

► The Huskers' 34 first downs against South Dakota State were the most in the past six seasons under Pelini, and NU's most since posting 35 first downs against Kansas State in 2007.

ENUNWA PRODUCING MONSTER SENIOR SEASON

Nebraska's passing game features several other options beyond Bell, led by senior receiver **Quincy Enunwa**.

The 6-2, 225-pound Enunwa has turned into the favorite red zone target for Nebraska's quarterbacks in 2013. Enunwa has caught six touchdowns, including a pair of touchdowns against both Southern Miss and UCLA. Enunwa leads the Big Ten and is tied for eighth in the country in touchdown receptions.

Enunwa entered the 2013 season with three career touchdowns, but has more than doubled that total this season. If Enunwa were to add a third multiple-TD catch game in 2013, he would be the first Husker with three games with two or more TD catches in a season since Irving Fryar in 1983. Enunwa is one touchdown catch from cracking the top 10 on the NU single-season touchdown receptions list.

Overall, Enunwa has 21 receptions for a team-high 282 yards this fall. He tied his career high with six receptions for 78 yards against South Dakota State, then posted a season-high 80 receiving yards on four catches against Illinois.

► Enunwa continues to move up the Nebraska career receptions list. With his four catches against Illinois, Enunwa increased his career total to 85 receptions, and moved into 10th place on the Husker career chart.

► Enunwa also eclipsed the 1,000-yard career receiving yardage mark against Illinois, becoming the 22nd Nebraska player to accomplish that feat. Enunwa now has 1,055 career receiving yards and is poised to continue to quickly move up that list, needing less than 200 receiving yards to move into the top 10.

► Enunwa has caught at least one pass in each of the past 19 games. A catch on Saturday at Purdue would tie Enunwa for the fourth-longest streak of consecutive games with a pass reception.

Last season, Enunwa caught 42 passes to rank just outside of the single-season top 10 on the NU charts. With both Bell and Enunwa topping the 40-catch barrier last season, Nebraska had a pair of players with at least 40 receptions for just the fifth time in school history.

Junior **Jamal Turner** adds a third reliable veteran receiver in the Husker offense. He opened the season with four catches for 43 yards against Wyoming, including a 17-yard touchdown grab. Turner has four TD receptions in his past 11 games, after not having a touchdown catch in the first 20 games of his NU career.

On the season, Turner has caught 11 passes for 83 yards and a touchdown and now has 58 career receptions. In 2013, the trio of Bell, Enunwa and Turner has combined for 54 catches for 620 yards and 10 touchdowns. A year ago, the group accumulated 124 receptions for 1,750 yards and 12 touchdowns.

► Turner was one of Nebraska's stars in the second half of 2012, as the 6-1, 185-pounder made the most of his first two career TD receptions. He caught a five-yard touchdown pass with six seconds left to provide the game-winning score at Michigan State and added a five-yard fourth-quarter grab for a score against Penn State to put the Huskers ahead for the first time. Turner finished with 32 catches for 417 yards in 2012, with 18 of his catches in the final six games.

LONG LEADS VETERAN HUSKER OFFENSIVE LINE

Offensive guard Spencer Long is the anchor of an experienced 2013 line that features five seniors who have seen extensive action throughout their Husker careers.

The 6-4, 315-pound Long has started every game at right guard since the start of the 2011 season and has been a key force in one of the nation's top offenses. The offensive line is paving the way for an offense that ranks in the top 20 nationally in scoring offense, total offense and rushing offense.

Last season, Nebraska led the Big Ten and ranked eighth nationally in rushing offense at 253.4 yards per game. The Huskers also topped the Big Ten in total offense averaging 460.8 yards per game.

Long's play was recognized in 2012. The former walk-on earned first-team All-Big Ten honors from both the league media and coaches, and was a second-team All-America pick by the Associated Press and the Walter Camp Foundation. Long became the first NU offensive lineman since 2001 to be named a first- or second-team All-American. He is the first returning All-American on the offensive line since 1997.

This fall, Long is a candidate for first-team All-America honors as well as a leading contender for the Outland Trophy. Nebraska boasts a nation-leading nine Outland Trophy winners, including six by offensive linemen.

Long's honors will likely go beyond the field. He has been an Academic All-District VII selection each of the past two years and is a strong candidate for first-team academic All-America honors this year. He is also a nominee for a National Football Foundation/College Hall of Fame post-graduate scholarship.

The veteran line also features returning senior starters in tackles Brent Qvale and Jeremiah Sirles. Sirles has started 33 games in his Nebraska career, including all 14 games at right tackle in 2012, and each of the first five games in 2013. Qvale earned 13 starts at left tackle last season and has played in 45 games in his career.

They are joined on the line by fellow seniors Cole Pensick and Andrew Rodriguez, who both had starting experience prior to this season. Pensick split time between guard and center in 2012, before starting the final two games at center, and each of the first five games this season. Rodriguez was the top reserve at tackle last season and has 13 career starts, including every game this season.

► In addition to plowing the way for a dominant rushing attack, the offensive line has also done an outstanding job of protecting all three Nebraska quarterbacks. Nebraska has allowed only two sacks in five games (0.40 pg) and leads the nation in that category. Nebraska has also thrown just one interception this season.

NEBRASKA ROSTER INCLUDES TWO

INDIANA NATIVES

The Nebraska roster features just two players from the state of Indiana who will return to their home state on Saturday. However, both players are newcomers to the program and have made an impact in their first season. Defensive end **Randy Gregory** (Fishers, Ind.) is starting at defensive end in his first season in the program and leads the team in tackles for loss and quarterback hurries. True freshman long snapper **Gabe Miller** (Mishawaka, Ind.) has stepped right into the snapping role in his first season in Lincoln.

OFFENSE CONTINUES TO HUM ALONG WITHOUT MARTINEZ

Quarterback Taylor Martinez has missed the past two Nebraska victories with a turf toe injury, but the Husker offense has not missed a beat without the senior signal caller. Redshirt freshman **Tommy Armstrong Jr.** has started both games in place of Martinez, while senior **Ron Kellogg III** has also seen extensive action in wins over South Dakota State and Illinois.

Armstrong has guided Nebraska on 16 drives this season, with 11 of those drives ending in touchdowns and another one resulting in a field goal.

▶ Armstrong directed one drive in a reserve role against Southern Miss that ended in a touchdown. Against South Dakota State, he engineered five drives with four ending in touchdowns, and one ending with a fumble. In the Big Ten opener against Illinois, Armstrong led 10 NU drives with five ending in touchdowns and another one in a field goal.

▶ In the past two games, Armstrong is 6-of-6 passing on third downs, with those completions resulting in 120 yards. All six completions have gone for first downs, including two touchdowns.

▶ Under the direction of Armstrong and Kellogg, Nebraska did not punt in the first half against either South Dakota State or Illinois.

▶ Nebraska rushed for 335 yards against both South Dakota State and Illinois and averaged 583.0 yards and 49.0 points in the two victories.

BLACKSHIRTS SHOWING PLAY-MAKING ABILITY IN 2013

Nebraska's defense posted one of its most explosive defensive games in the past couple seasons in a 56-13 victory over Southern Miss on Sept. 7. That game sparked a defense that has shown the ability to take the ball away from the opposition and also make plays in the opposition's backfield.

▶ Nebraska has posted 10 interceptions and 12 total takeaways in the season's first five games. Last year, Nebraska had 13 interceptions and 23 total takeaways in 14 games.

▶ Nebraska has turned its 12 takeaways this season into 62 points.

▶ The Huskers' 10 interceptions rank second in the Big Ten and sixth nationally.

The Southern Miss game marked the most impressive defensive outing of the season, sparked by a **Stanley Jean-Baptiste** interception and 43-yard return for a touchdown on the game's third play.

▶ Jean-Baptiste's interception was the first of four Nebraska INTs vs. Southern Miss. The four interceptions were the most since a 2010 victory over Idaho when the Huskers had five picks.

▶ Nebraska's four takeaways against Southern Miss marked the first time NU has had four takeaways since forcing six turnovers against Idaho in that 2010 game, a span of 41 games.

▶ Nebraska returned two of its four interceptions for touchdowns against Southern Miss, marking the first two-TD game for the Blackshirts since 2010.

▶ Jean-Baptiste had an interception in each of Nebraska's four games this season. His streak of four straight games with an interception tied the NU school record. He was the first player to accomplish that feat since All-American safety Josh Bullocks intercepted a pass in four straight games in 2003.

▶ Jean-Baptiste has 134 interception return yards, the most by a Husker since Daniel Bullocks had a school-record 187 interception return yards in 2004.

▶ Cornerback **Ciante Evans** had two interceptions against the Golden Eagles. The last time a Husker had picked off two or more opponent passes occurred in 2009 when safety Matt O'Hanlon had three interceptions against Oklahoma.

▶ With four interceptions, Jean-Baptiste is tied for second nationally in interceptions. Evans has three interceptions to rank in a tie for third in the Big Ten, and a tie for 13th nationally. Last season, Daimion Stafford led Nebraska with four interceptions, while the team leader in 2011 had just two picks.

▶ Nebraska has an interception for every 16.6 pass attempts it has faced in 2013, an average that leads the Big Ten.

▶ Nebraska is a +5 in turnover margin this season, and its +1.0 per game average is tied for first in the Big Ten and 18th nationally. Nebraska has been even or positive in the turnover margin each game in 2013. The Huskers are 2-0 this season when forcing three or more turnovers, and 17-2 under Pelini when the defense has at least three takeaways.

▶ Nebraska's streak of five straight games having an even or positive turnover margin is the longest streak for Nebraska since a five-game streak during Big Ten play in 2011. Nebraska had a streak of 10 straight games with a positive or even turnover margin spanning the final seven games of 2009 and the first three contests of 2010.

▶ The pass defense success is nothing new for Nebraska. When combining stats since the start of the 2009 season, Nebraska ranks third nationally in pass efficiency defense and fourth in passing yards allowed per game.

Nebraska has also been much improved in making plays in the opponent backfield. Nebraska has had at least three sacks in each of the last three games, totaling 11 quarterback sacks in those three games. Nebraska's five sacks against South Dakota State were its most since posting seven vs. Idaho State in 2012.

Against Southern Miss, Nebraska recorded nine tackles for loss as a team. That total was Nebraska's best since recording 12 TFL last season against Idaho State. The Huskers added nine tackles for loss against UCLA, six against South Dakota State and a season-high 10 tackles for loss against Illinois. Over the past four games, Nebraska has a total of 34 tackles for loss.

HUSKERS NAME CAPTAINS FOR 2013 SEASON

Nebraska has named season-long team captains for the 2013 season, a first in the Bo Pelini era. Leading the Huskers as captains are senior quarterback **Taylor Martinez**, senior wide receiver **Quincy Enunwa**, senior offensive guard **Spencer Long** and senior cornerback **Ciante Evans**.

In each of the previous five seasons under Pelini, Nebraska has named captains on a game-by-game basis throughout the regular season, before electing season captains at the end of the year.

The four 2013 captains bring a great deal of experience to the Huskers. As a group, the four players have played in a total of 157 games with a combined 125 starts.

Martinez also holds the distinction of being one of just seven multi-year captains in school history. Four of those have come under Bo Pelini, including Martinez, Rex Burkhead, Brett Maher and Alex Henery. Prior to Henery in 2009 and 2010, the most recent two-time captain was Ed Weir in 1924-25, while the first two-time captains were James H. Johnson in 1891-92 and John Westover in 1901-02.

HUSKER YOUTH MAKE BIG IMPACT AGAINST SDSU, EARLY IN SEASON

Nebraska's freshmen have been a big part of the early-season success for Nebraska, most notably in the Huskers' 59-20 rout of South Dakota State on Sept. 21. A total of 24 true or redshirt freshmen saw the field against the Jackrabbits including offensive starters **Cethan Carter** (TE) and **Tommy Armstrong Jr.** (QB) and defensive starters **Vincent Valentine** (DT), **Nathan Gerry** (LB) and **Josh Banderas** (LB). The SDSU game is believed to be the first time in modern school history that NU has started five freshmen in the same game.

Offensively, freshmen accounted for more than half of Nebraska's total plays against South Dakota State. Husker freshmen combined for 39 offensive touches and 297 total yards against the Jackrabbits, averaging 7.6 yards per touch.

On the ground, the freshmen combined for 23 carries, 128 yards and two touchdowns. Through the air, Armstrong completed 12-of-15 passes for 169 yards and one touchdown, while **Ryker Fyfe** completed a five-yard pass in his only attempt of the game. Freshmen also accounted for five pass receptions.

Defensively, the freshmen combined for 15 tackles, a half sack and one tackle for loss against South Dakota State. Freshmen also are making big contributions on special teams with redshirt freshman **Sam Foltz** serving as Nebraska's punter, while **Jordan Westerkamp** is NU's top punt returner.

Overall, the Huskers have played seven true freshmen this fall, the most in Bo Pelini's six seasons as head coach. The group includes, Carter, Banderas, Gerry, I-back **Terrell Newby**, defensive tackle **Kevin Maurice**, defensive tackle **Maliek Collins** and long snapper **Gabriel Miller**.

▶ Against Southern Miss, UCLA and South Dakota State, Banderas and Gerry were both on the field as starters on defense. They marked the first true freshmen defenders to start since Ciante Evans started at Iowa State in 2011. It also marked the first time Nebraska started two true freshmen in a game since NU had two freshmen starters against Kansas State in 2007. Nebraska also started two redshirt freshmen (Afalava, M. Rose) against Illinois. The past four games marked the first time Nebraska had started two true freshmen on defense since Erwin Swiney and Joe Walker started against Texas Tech in 1997.

▶ Nebraska had three true freshmen in the starting lineup against UCLA and South Dakota State as Carter joined Gerry and Banderas in the starting lineup.

▶ Banderas and Gerry are representative of the youth movement in the front seven of Nebraska's defense. The Huskers feature 12 sophomores, redshirt freshmen or true freshmen in the two-deep of its front seven on defense.

▶ Nebraska is much more experienced on offense, but Newby and Carter have quickly emerged as play-makers as true freshmen. Newby has 40 carries for 229 yards and two touchdowns, while Carter has been in the regular rotation at tight end and has three receptions for 55 yards.

SEVEN HUSKERS PLACED ON SCHOLARSHIP FOR 2013 SEASON

Nebraska Head Coach Bo Pelini announced on Aug. 24 that seven Husker players who originally joined the program as walk-ons would be on scholarship for the 2013 season. The group includes three 2013 seniors who were on scholarship during the spring semester and will remain on scholarship for their final season as Huskers. That trio includes quarterback **Ron Kellogg III**, tight end **Jake Long** and safety **Wil Richards**.

Kellogg III served as Nebraska's No. 2 quarterback last season and is handling that role again this fall. Long was part of Nebraska's regular rotation at tight end the past two seasons and is the starter at the position in 2013. Jake Long joins his twin brother, Spencer, as walk-ons who have gone on to earn a scholarship, as Spencer Long received the honor last fall. Richards has been a key member of the Nebraska special teams the past two years.

Four additional Huskers have been placed on scholarship for the first time including senior defensive tackle **Brodrick Nickens**, senior linebacker **Colby Starkebaum**, junior center **Mark Pelini** and sophomore fullback **Andy Janovich**.

Nickens made the move from offensive line to defensive tackle in the spring, and add depth there this fall. Starkebaum is a second-generation Husker, following in the footsteps of his father, John, who lettered for NU from 1972-74. The younger Starkebaum has been a reserve linebacker and key scout team performer throughout his career, and is seeing action on special teams this fall.

Pelini alternates at the center position after serving as the backup at the spot last season. Janovich played as a true freshman at fullback last season and shares playing time with the top unit in 2013. Janovich earned a scholarship in just his second season in the program, the quickest any player has moved from walk-on to scholarship under Pelini.

Overall, the group of new scholarship recipients includes four native Nebraskans in Kellogg, Long, Janovich and Nickens. Richards joined the NU program from Lee's Summit, Mo., Pelini is a Youngstown, Ohio native, while Starkebaum joined the NU program from Sterling, Colo.

The announcement continues a long Husker tradition of walk-ons earning scholarships during their career at Nebraska. Pelini has now placed 26 former walk-ons on scholarship during his six seasons as Nebraska's head coach.

2013 SCHEDULE FEATURES EIGHT HOME GAMES

Nebraska is playing eight home games in 2013, marking the first time in five seasons and just the seventh time in school history the Huskers will play eight home games. Nebraska completed its five-game season-opening homestand against Illinois last Saturday. The 2013 season marks the first time NU has opened with five home games since 2008.

Nebraska will play two road games to complete its October schedule, heading to Purdue this weekend, before traveling to Minnesota on Oct. 26.

Nebraska will face a demanding stretch of games in November beginning with a Nov. 2 visit from Northwestern. Michigan State (Nov. 16) and Iowa (Nov. 29) will visit Lincoln in the final month of the regular season, while NU must travel to Michigan (Nov. 9) and Penn State (Nov. 23).

- ▶ The schedule includes six teams that participated in a bowl game last season, including five Big Ten opponents.
- ▶ Nebraska is facing Illinois and Purdue for the first time as Big Ten opponents, after not facing the two schools in 2011 and 2012.
- ▶ Nebraska and Iowa will meet in the third Heroes Game on Friday, Nov. 29, the day after Thanksgiving. It will mark the 24th straight year Nebraska has played on Black Friday.

MEMORIAL STADIUM CONSTRUCTION COMPLETE FOR 2013 SEASON

Fans coming to Memorial Stadium this fall are greeted by a new look to the East side of Memorial Stadium. The East Stadium expansion will push Nebraska's average attendance beyond 90,000. While adding nearly 6,000 seats, including a combination of club seats, suites and general public seating, the addition preserves the rich tradition and original architecture of Memorial Stadium.

The East Stadium addition also includes dedicated restrooms and concessions areas. A new grand lobby, expanded concourse and additional first-aid areas also were added. No East Stadium seats were removed during the expansion and no season ticket holders were required to relocate their seats as part of this project.

The addition includes dedicated areas on the ground floor for research, both for Athletics and UNL Research. The 50,000-square foot research area is a unique collaboration between Athletics and Academics. The Nebraska Athletic Performance Lab is housed on the north end of the facility, and is operated by the Athletic Department. The Center for Brain, Biology and Behavior is housed in the south half of the facility.

Along with the additions on the East Stadium, Nebraska also replaced the FieldTurf at Memorial Stadium this summer. The field features the "Tom Osborne Field" lettering for the first time since the 1998 season.

NEBRASKA UNVEILS STATUE OF BOB DEVANEY IN EAST STADIUM

The University of Nebraska unveiled a statue of Hall-of-Fame Football Coach and former Husker Athletic Director Bob Devaney the day before the 2013 season opener. The statue was installed in the new East Stadium Plaza which serves as the doorstep to a 52,000 square-foot research facility, 38 new suites, 6,000 new seats and a graphic-rich tribute to Nebraska football tradition inside the historic Gate 20 entrance.

The life-sized bronze statue of Devaney, sculpted by Omaha artist Joe Putjeter, was unveiled in a ceremony attended by Mike Devaney and Rob Devaney, Bob's respective son and grandson, Nebraska Director of Athletics Shawn Eichorst, Tom Osborne, Nebraska's former head coach and athletic director, and UNL Chancellor Harvey Perlman.

Nebraska had only three winning teams in the 21 seasons before Devaney arrived. Devaney's teams won back-to-back national championships in 1970 and '71 and captured eight conference championships in his 11 years as head coach. His overall 101-20-2 record in 11 years at Nebraska included a 32-game unbeaten streak. His career head coaching record at both schools was 136-30-7 for winning percentage of .806. While he was head coach at Nebraska, Memorial Stadium attendance more than doubled to 72,700.

Devaney and Osborne became the third coaching duo to post back-to-back 100-win careers at the same institutions, but the first pair to accomplish that feat in just 22 years. Devaney served as Nebraska's Athletic Director for 26 years from 1967 to 1993.

NCAA RECORD SELLOUT STREAK CONTINUES IN 2013

One of the most remarkable streaks in collegiate sports passed its 50th anniversary last fall, and continues into the 2013 season. Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, and the streak hit 330 games against Illinois.

With three additional home games in 2013, the streak is likely to reach 333 by season's end. NU celebrated the 300th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 26, 2009, against Louisiana-Lafayette, with a then-stadium record crowd of 86,304. Notre Dame is second in all-time consecutive sellouts with 236, 94 fewer than the Huskers. Nebraska established a new stadium record for attendance against UCLA on Sept. 14 with a crowd of 91,471. The crowd ranks as the eighth-largest to see any Nebraska game.



FRAZIER SALUTED FOR COLLEGE

FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME INDUCTION

Former NU quarterback **Tommy Frazier** was honored at halftime of the UCLA game on Sept. 14. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame honored Frazier with an NFF/College Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute. Frazier was one of 14 FBS players selected for the College Football Hall of Fame in May, and he will be officially inducted later this year in New York City.

Frazier will become the 16th NU player in the College Football Hall of Fame, along with six former Cornhusker coaches. Frazier earned induction into the College Hall of Fame in his third year on the ballot. He is the third Husker in the past five years to be named to the Hall, joining 2009 inductee Grant Wistrom and 2011 honoree Will Shields.

Frazier is the first NU quarterback to be selected for the College Football Hall of Fame. The Bradenton, Fla., native was a four-year starter at quarterback for the Huskers from 1992 to 1995, guiding Nebraska to three straight national title games in his final three seasons, including national championships in 1994 and 1995. Frazier posted a 33-3 record as a starting quarterback for the Huskers.

NEBRASKA HONORS 1964 ORANGE BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

Nebraska recognized the 50th anniversary of the 1963 Cornhuskers at the Southern Miss game, as several members of the team were on hand for a pre-game recognition. The team earned a berth in the 1964 Orange Bowl and defeated Auburn, 13-7. The Huskers made their second Orange Bowl appearance in 1964, but their first under second-year head coach Bob Devaney. Nebraska notched its first Orange Bowl victory in the 1964 contest, while also winning for the first time in three tries in what are now considered Bowl Championship Series (BCS) bowl games.

NU finished with a final 10-1 record in 1963, including the Orange Bowl victory. The Huskers won the Big Eight title with a perfect 7-0 mark, and Nebraska's lone setback was a 17-13 home loss to Air Force. No. 10 NU earned a berth in the Orange Bowl with a 29-20 victory against sixth-ranked Oklahoma in the regular-season finale, which clinched Nebraska's first Big Eight title and first overall conference crown since 1940.

HUSKERS LOOK TO CONTINUE DOMINANCE AT MEMORIAL STADIUM

Nebraska has rewarded the loyalty of its fans with incredible success at Memorial Stadium through the years.

» Nebraska has won at least six home games in 22 of the past 27 seasons, including 2012. Nebraska is 152-21 (.879) at home in the last 25 seasons (since 1989).

» Nebraska finished 7-0 at home in 2012 and is 23-3 at home over the past three seasons. Nebraska's perfect home season in 2012 was its first since 2001. The Huskers had a 10-game home winning streak snapped in the loss to UCLA.

» During Nebraska's run of success at home in the past three decades, NU has had three home winning streaks of 20 or more games, and overall has posted 41 unbeaten and untied home seasons.

» The Huskers are 521-140-20 (.780, 681 games, 124 years) in Lincoln, and 396-117-13 (.765, 526 games, 90 years) in Memorial Stadium (since 1923). The 2012 season marked the 44th straight season NU had a winning season at Memorial Stadium. With a 4-1 record at home in 2013, Nebraska needs one additional victory in its final three home games to ensure a 45th straight winning season.

2013 HUSKERS LOOK TO CONTINUE ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Nebraska has a long history of academic success in its football program. In 2012, Nebraska had two academic All-Americans in first-team selection Rex Burkhead and second-teamer Sean Fisher. The two football academic All-Americans put Nebraska over the 300-mark in academic All-Americans in all sports and Nebraska has a nation-leading 104 football academic All-Americans.

The 2013 Huskers will look to continue Nebraska's outstanding academic tradition. Twin brothers Spencer and Jake Long each earned Academic All-District VII honors last season and will be strong candidates for academic All-America honors this fall, with several other Huskers in line to contend for academic honors as well.

GRADS FILL 2013 HUSKER ROSTER

Coach Bo Pelini's Husker teams have an excellent tradition of excelling in the classroom and the 2013 team is no different. Among the 23 members of Nebraska's 2013 senior class, six players had earned their degrees by the end of the spring semester. Another three players finished in August, while place-kicker Pat Smith joined the NU program as a Western Illinois graduate. Nebraska's 10 graduate students during the 2013 season ranks third among all FBS schools, trailing only 12 graduates for both Louisiana Tech and Virginia Tech.

Offensive lineman Cole Pensick and fullback C.J. Zimmerer graduated last December, while defensive end Jason Ankrah, cornerback Stanley Jean-Baptiste and offensive linemen Brent Qvale and Jeremiah Sirles finished their degree work in May. Andrew Green, Thad Randle and Mo Seisay joined the group as graduates in August.

IMANI CROSS RECEIVES BERRINGER SCHOLARSHIP

Sophomore I-back Imani Cross was presented with the Brook Berringer Memorial Scholarship at the UCLA game. The scholarship was endowed in the memory of former Nebraska quarterback Brook Berringer, who died in a plane crash on April 18, 1996, just three months after helping Nebraska to a second straight national championship.

Cross, who has not declared a major, earned a spot on the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll last fall. He also earned a Nebraska Student-Athlete HERO Leadership award in 2013, in addition to being named to the Brook Berringer Citizenship Team, which is also named in honor of the late Husker quarterback. To be eligible for the Brook Berringer Memorial Scholarship, a football student-athlete must be involved in community service with high ideals, excellent character and integrity.

JAKE LONG RECEIVES SULLIVAN SCHOLARSHIP

Tight end Jake Long was presented with the George Sullivan Endowed Scholarship before the Southern Miss game on Sept. 7. The scholarship, presented by the Touchdown Club and friends, is named in honor of George Sullivan, who served as NU's head athletic trainer from 1977 to 1995 and as an assistant athletic trainer and head physical therapist from 1953 to 1977.

Long, a senior biological sciences/pre-medicine major, will earn his degree this December. He carries a cumulative grade-point average above 3.85 and is a strong candidate for CoSIDA Academic All-America honors this fall, after earning a spot on the all-district team in 2012. Long has also been a member of the honor roll every semester of his career.

The scholarship was fully endowed in Sullivan's honor in 2008 by the Touchdown Club of Nebraska, Inc., and many former Husker student-athletes graciously contributed to the fund. The scholarship is presented annually to a "Nebraska varsity football student-athlete who has demonstrated a high level of athletic and academic achievement, with a strong commitment to community, effective leadership skills, a high degree of integrity, and commitment to excellence in all endeavors." Preference is given to student-athletes who intend to pursue a career in a health-related field.

C.J. ZIMMERER NAMED TO AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Fullback C.J. Zimmerer was honored for his efforts on and off the field on Sept. 17, as he was named to the 2013 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Zimmerer's award was recognized on the field before the South Dakota State game.

Zimmerer, a senior fullback from Omaha, has been a mainstay on offense and special teams throughout his career. He has played in 32 career games, including a pair of starts this season.

Zimmerer served as the inaugural president of the Uplifting Athletes chapter at Nebraska during the 2012-13 year, raising money and awareness for pediatric brain cancer. A two-time member of the Brook Berringer Citizenship team, Zimmerer has also volunteered his time with team hospital and school visits, including Madonna Rehabilitation Center, Cub Scouts, School is Cool Week, Husker Hotline, Husker Connect and the YWCA. In the classroom, he graduated in 3.5 years and is a candidate for CoSIDA Academic All-America honors.

The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® recognizes college football players at all levels of the sport for inspiring acts of service and off-the-field achievements. This summer, the program received a record 150 nominations from colleges and universities across the country. From the nominations, a voting panel selected 11 players from the FBS Subdivision and 11 players from the FCS Subdivision, Divisions II, III and the NAIA to comprise the 22-player team.

Zimmerer is the 14th NU football player to earn the honor since its inception in 1992, a total which ties Georgia for the national lead in that category. Last year, Rex Burkhead claimed the honor and was selected as the team captain based on fan voting.

NEWEST HALL OF FAME MEMBERS RECOGNIZED

The 2013 Nebraska Football Hall of Fame Class was recognized before the start of the South Dakota State game after an induction ceremony and dinner the previous night. Four former Husker greats, including a trio of defensive backs, lead the 2013 class of inductees into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame.

All-American cornerback **Keyuo Craver** and All-Big Eight safeties **Reggie Cooper** and **Russell Gary** anchor an award-winning group of Blackshirts being inducted into the Hall of Fame. The trio of ball-hawking defenders is joined by All-Big Eight offensive lineman **John Havekost**, who helped his 1978 Husker team lead the nation in total offense.

Nebraska Wesleyan All-America wide receiver Tim Beebe joined the Huskers in this year's class. Beebe earned All-America honors at NWU in 1987. The Hall also recognized Ernie and Jan Thayer of Grand Island with its Clarence E. Swanson Meritorious Service Award. Tom and Mary Hansen of Papillion were honored with the Lyell Bremser Special Merit Award.



NEBRASKA AMONG LEADERS IN

ASSOCIATED PRESS NATIONAL TITLES

Notre Dame and Alabama lead the nation by winning eight Associated Press national titles since 1936, with Oklahoma (7), Miami (5), USC (5), Nebraska (4) and Minnesota (4) next in line. While the Huskers were awarded the national title by the coaches in 1997, NU finished second to Michigan in the AP poll.

In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the AP national title, but not the coaches (Texas was first, Ohio State second and NU third) as the final poll was released before the bowl games were played. In the coaches poll (since 1950), NU is tied for fourth with Miami and Texas with four titles, behind Alabama (8), Oklahoma (6) and USC (5).

CONFERENCE CROWNS

Nebraska has won 43 football conference championships in school history and is looking for its first Big Ten Conference crown in 2013. The Huskers won 13 conference titles under Tom Osborne and eight under Bob Devaney.

During its 15-year history in the Big 12 Conference, Nebraska won league titles in 1997 and 1999, and also appeared in the Big 12 Championship Game in 1996, 2006, 2009 and 2010. Nebraska was one of just three teams to capture two or more Big 12 titles in the first 15 years of the league, joining Oklahoma and Texas. Nebraska's six Big 12 title game appearances were second only to Oklahoma's eight. Nebraska made its first appearance in the Big Ten Championship Game in 2012.

NEBRASKA THIRD IN ALL-TIME

BOWL APPEARANCES

Nebraska played in its 49th all-time bowl game with its appearance in the 2013 Capital One Bowl. The Huskers have played in the postseason in 42 of the past 44 seasons, including an NCAA-record 35 straight bowl games from 1969 to 2003. NU is 2-3 in bowl games during Bo Pelini's five full seasons as head coach and owns a 24-25 all-time bowl record.

The Huskers' 49 all-time bowl appearances overall tie for third, trailing only Alabama (59) and Texas (51) and tying with Tennessee (49). Nebraska's 24 bowl victories rank seventh nationally.

Nebraska played the first of its 49 bowls in the Rose Bowl, when No. 7 Nebraska lost to No. 2 Stanford, 21-13, following the 1940 season. Nebraska's 35 consecutive bowls began with a 45-6 win over Georgia in the 1969 Sun Bowl, and ended following its appearance in the 2003 Alamo Bowl. The Huskers have been successful in recent years, winning 10 of their last 16 bowl games since the 1994 season.

Lincoln (Aug. 31) --- No. 18 Nebraska rushed for 375 yards and amassed 530 total yards on its way to a 37-34 victory over Wyoming for the Huskers' 28th consecutive season-opening win.

Playing in front of a school-record 91,185 fans at Memorial Stadium, Nebraska rolled up 375 yards on 63 rushes, including 114 yards from junior I-back Ameer Abdullah and 105 yards and a pair of touchdowns for sophomore I-back Imani Cross. Senior quarterback Taylor Martinez also completed 17-of-22 passes for 155 yards and three touchdowns, including a pair of scoring strikes to Quincy Enunwa.

Despite the impressive offensive totals for the Huskers, a pair of late NU turnovers allowed the visiting Cowboys to put a scare into the Big Red.

NU led 37-21 with the ball on the Wyoming 25 with just under seven minutes left in the game, but a Martinez pass was intercepted by Wyoming's Blair Burns and returned to the Wyoming 48. It took quarterback Brett Smith and the Cowboys just two plays and 24 seconds to find paydirt, as Smith hit receiver Jalen Claiborne to trim NU's lead to 37-27, after Wyoming's two-point conversion attempt was smothered by Husker defensive back Josh Mitchell. After another turnover, Smith struck quickly again, hitting receiver Robert Herron on a 47-yard touchdown pass just 29 seconds later to pull Wyoming within 37-34.

On NU's ensuing drive, Wyoming forced a three-and-out by the Huskers, who got a clutch 31-yard punt from Sam Foltz that was caught by NU's Kenny Bell at the Wyoming 6. Smith got a chance at the upset, but the Husker defense held Wyoming without a shot at the end zone to escape with the victory. Smith completed 29-of-43 passes for 383 yards with four touchdowns in a losing effort, although Ciente Evans and Stanley Jean-Baptiste each pulled down interceptions for the Huskers.

Overall, the two teams combined for 1,132 yards of total offense, as Wyoming finished with 602 total yards, including 219 yards on the ground. The Cowboys' total yards marked the eighth-highest mark against the Big Red in school history.

Lincoln (Sept. 7) --- No. 22 Nebraska's Blackshirt defense hauled in four interceptions, including two for scores, while Taylor Martinez threw three touchdown passes in a 56-13 win over Southern Miss.

Nebraska's opportunistic defense was the story, as Stanley Jean-Baptiste and Ciente Evans both returned passes for TDs, as the Huskers jumped out to a 21-3 first-quarter lead and never looked back. Nebraska turned four USM turnovers into 21 points in picking up its 10th straight home victory.

Nebraska finished the night with 479 total yards, including 285 rushing and 194 passing. I-back Ameer Abdullah led NU's ground game with 17 carries for 114 yards and touchdown runs of 3 and 37 yards. Martinez went 15-for-23 through the air for 170 yards and three scores in just over two and a half quarters of action.

While the offense enjoyed substituting freely and spreading the ball around with the lopsided win, the Blackshirts celebrated a strong effort. Nebraska's defense intercepted four passes, including a pair by senior Ciente Evans. Jean-Baptiste set the tone early, returning Allan Bridgford's pass 43 yards for a score on USM's first offensive series.

The Blackshirts held Southern Miss to 284 total yards, including 62 on the ground. In fact, USM had just four rushing yards until midway through the fourth quarter. In addition to the three combined interceptions by Evans (2) and Jean-Baptiste, Corey Cooper grabbed the first interception of his career for Nebraska.

The Blackshirts also notched nine tackles for loss on the day. Harvey Jackson led the Huskers with seven tackles, including a tackle for loss that helped thwart a late USM scoring threat.

Lincoln (Sept. 14) -- In a tale of two halves, No. 23 Nebraska bolted to a 21-3 lead, but No. 16 UCLA closed with 38 unanswered points in the final two-and-half quarters to leave Memorial Stadium with a 41-21 victory over the Huskers.

Playing in front of the NCAA-record 328th consecutive sellout and the largest crowd (91,471) in Memorial Stadium history, the Huskers had their 14-game home non-conference winning streak snapped, along with their streak of 10-straight home wins.

Nebraska used defense and special teams to bolt to an early lead against the Bruins. On UCLA's second possession, Stanley Jean-Baptiste picked off a Brett Hundley pass and returned it 34 yards to give NU great field position. Moments later, Martinez found Quincy Enunwa for an 11-yard scoring strike.

Leading 7-3, NU went on a 17-play, 92-yard drive capped by another Martinez to Enunwa touchdown play, this time from 18 yards. In the second quarter, NU took advantage of a botched punt snap, as Randy Gregory tackled UCLA punter Sean Covington at the UCLA 26. Two plays later, Martinez found Kenny Bell on a 22-yard TD pass to push the Husker lead to 21-3.

The Bruins' high-powered finally found the end zone against the Blackshirts with 57 seconds left in the first half to trim the NU margin to 11 points.

The Huskers went to halftime with a 21-10 edge, but the second half belonged to Hundley and the Bruins, as UCLA scored touchdowns on all four of its third-quarter possessions to take control of the game. The sophomore quarterback finished 16-of-24 for 294 yards and three second-half touchdown passes. He also ran 19 times for 61 yards. James Jordan led the UCLA ground game with 105 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries. Overall, UCLA amassed 504 total yards, including 210 on the ground and 294 through the air. The Bruins rolled up 157 rushing yards in the second half.

Nebraska managed 326 total yards for the game, but just 130 in the second half, including just 43 yards on the ground after halftime. Martinez completed 21-of-35 passes for 203 yards and three touchdowns in the game. Abdullah led the NU ground game with 98 yards on 23 carries, while adding three receptions for 50 yards. But Martinez was thrown for minus-13 yards rushing on 10 attempts. No other Husker back managed 20 yards. Enunwa had three catches for 39 yards and two scores, while Bell led the Husker receivers with six catches for 68 yards.

Lincoln (Sept. 21) -- Tommy Armstrong Jr. and Ron Kellogg III led Nebraska in place of injured starting quarterback Taylor Martinez, and the Husker offense produced the biggest total offense day under Bo Pelini in a 59-20 victory over South Dakota State.

Armstrong Jr. earned the first start of his career and helped the Huskers amass 645 yards of total offense with the first 300-yard rushing/300-yard passing day as a team in school history. Armstrong Jr. completed 12-of-15 passes for 169 yards and a touchdown pass, while Kellogg III was equally productive, completing 8-of-9 passes for 136 yards and a touchdown strike of his own. Armstrong Jr. and Kellogg III engineered scoring drives on eight of their 10 offensive possessions.

NU finished with 310 passing yards and 335 rushing yards, led by Ameer Abdullah's 139 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries. Imani Cross added 60 yards and two scores on just 10 carries, while freshman Terrell Newby contributed 52 yards and two touchdowns on eight carries. Armstrong Jr. pitched in 38 yards on five totes. Senior Quincy Enunwa led the Husker receivers with six catches for 78 yards. Abdullah contributed three receptions for 46 yards, while Tyler Wullenwaber added a pair of receptions for 47 yards, including his first career touchdown.

While the offense was firing on all cylinders, the defense also made some significant contributions. The Blackshirts forced a trio of Jackrabbit turnovers, including defensive end Randy Gregory's first career interception and touchdown, which came after a 33-yard return early in the fourth quarter. Gregory finished with five tackles, including two for loss and a half sack.

Stanley Jean-Baptiste added his fourth interception of the season and a 15-yard return, giving him an interception in each of NU's first four games of the year. Jonathan Rose added a fourth-quarter fumble recovery for the Huskers, who held a high-powered SDSU offense to just three points in the final three quarters.

Lincoln, Neb. (Oct. 5) – Ameer Abdullah rushed for a career-high 225 yards and two touchdowns to lead Nebraska to a 39-19 Big Ten-opening win over Illinois on Homecoming at Memorial Stadium.



Abdullah carried the load throughout the day for the Huskers, powering a Nebraska rushing attack that amassed 335 yards on the ground. Abdullah carried 20 times, including a highlight reel 43-yard touchdown run on NU's opening drive of the second half to put the Huskers up 30-5. He also opened the scoring for the Big Red with a two-yard run on the Huskers' first drive of the game, to help spark a quick 17-0 NU lead.

Nebraska rolled up 521 yards of total offense against the Illini. Imani Cross added 76 yards and a touchdown run on 15 carries, while Terrell Newby pitched in 19 yards on four carries.

Quarterback Tommy Armstrong Jr. had another solid performance in his second career start, completing 8-of-13 passes for 135 yards and two scores. His four-yard pass to senior wide receiver Quincy Enunwa midway through the first quarter put the Huskers up 14-0. He added a spectacular 37-yard connection with junior wide receiver Kenny Bell in the third quarter to give the Huskers a 36-12 lead at the end of three quarters.

Enunwa finished the day with four catches for 80 yards, while crossing the 1,000-yard receiving mark for his career. Bell added four catches for 65 yards. Redshirt freshman tight end Sam Cotton added the first catch of his career, while fellow tight end Jake Long pitched in one catch for nine yards.

The Blackshirts provided a solid defensive presence, holding the Fighting Illini to just 10 offensive points until the final minute of the game. Illinois finished with 372 total yards, including 195 on the ground and 177 through the air. The Blackshirts held quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase to just 13-of-26 passing for 135 yards, while limiting Scheelhaase to just 11 yards on nine carries. Josh Ferguson carried 19 times for 114 yards and a score to lead the Illini, while adding eight receptions for 82 yards out of the backfield.

Redshirt freshman linebacker Michael Rose led the Husker defense with 11 tackles, while junior safety Corey Cooper added 10 stops with a TFL. Sophomore Randy Gregory wreaked havoc from his defensive end spot throughout the day with eight tackles, including a TFL and a quarterback hurry. Defensive back Ciante Evans also made plays all over the field, including forcing a fumble on the Illini's first drive that helped the Huskers jump to a 14-0 lead. Evans, who finished with four tackles, notched a sack among his two tackles for loss while adding a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry. Jason Ankrh added two tackles for loss and a sack, while pulling down an interception on pass hurried by Evans in the second half.
