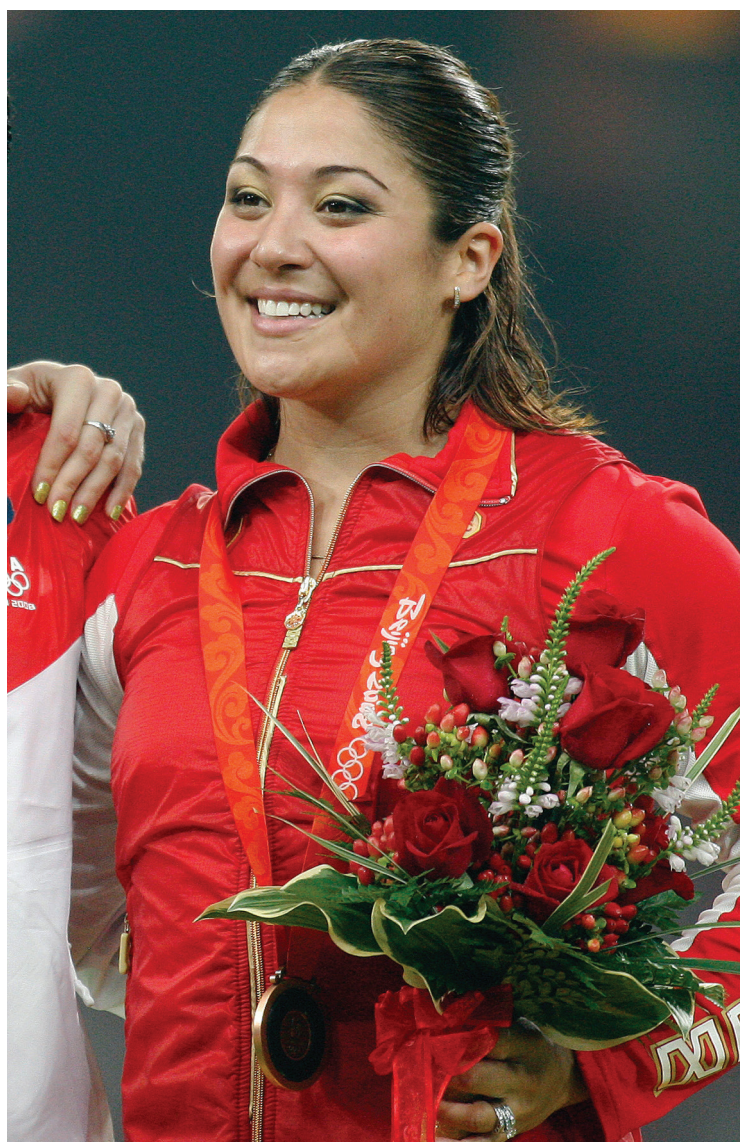
2008 (Beijing)

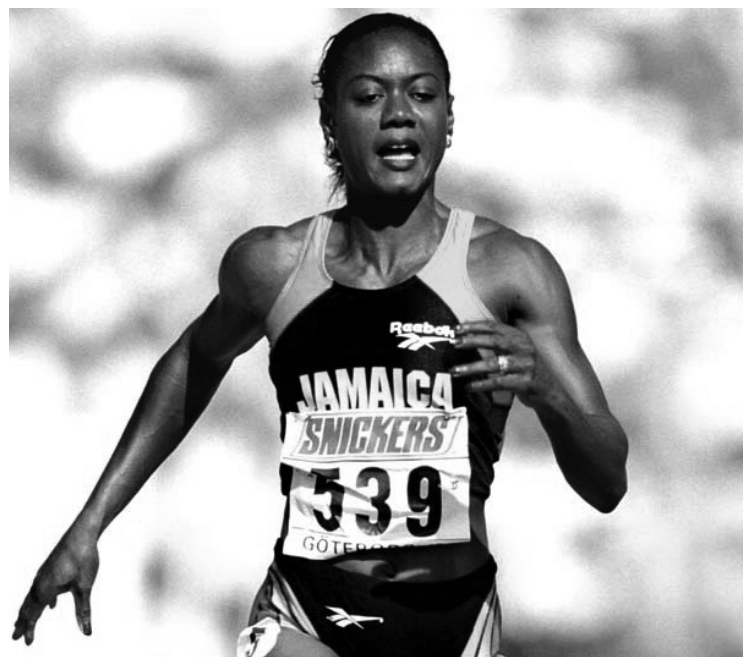
2016 (Rio de Janeiro)

Priscilla Lopes-Schliep was the first Husker on the men's or women's side to win a medal in the hurdles at the Olympics. With her bronze medal at the 2008 Games in Beijing, Lopes-Schliep became the first athlete to win a medal in track and field for Canada since Donovan Bailey in 1996.



Merlene Ottey made trips to the 1980, 1984, 1988, 1992, 1996 and 2000 Olympic Games for Jamaica before competing for Slovenia in 2004. Ottey won eight Olympic medals in her career with her first being a bronze in the 200 meters at the 1984 Games in Moscow.
